There is a lot of concern among church folks in Europe and America about the future of the church. Study after study suggests that faith and trust in God

are in steep decline and that our young people will grow up without connection to God. I don't dismiss these trends outright, but I would like to offer signs of hope and a reminder about the faithfulness of God.

I am writing this article from Altoona, PA where the youth are on their mission trip. We are working with an organization called TEAMeffort which had made connections with the faith community here in the city of Altoona in order to identify families who could use some help fixing their homes. We have been working all week with a family whose matriarch is Sandie. Sandie's husband is in the early stages of dementia and she spends much of her time caring for him. Their adult son also currently lives with them as he is recovering from an operation. Our task for the week is to paint her house doing all the prep work and cleaning that is required to do this job to the best of our abilities. This is not necessarily glamorous work, but here is the hopeful part. First, seventeen of our young people have committed to be of service this week and to show God's love by helping Ms. Sandie and her family. They have worked hard and demonstrated kindness to her and to each other. It is clear in their attitudes and in their effort that they are caring and compassionate young people. Second, we are here with probably 100 other youth who are showing the same faith and compassion alongside us this week. Third, the staff who are here with us are all young adults in their early

twenties and they have led us in worship, shared devotions with us, and most of all testified in their words and actions that they are committed to following Jesus Christ. The leader assigned to our group, Chelsea, shared some of her story with everyone last night in chapel and it was inspiring to our youth and us adults. She spoke about her desire to leave behind the things that keep her running from God and make the tough choices required to dedicate her life to the way of Jesus. After the nightly chapel service, we get together to share as Fairfield. I think all of us adult leaders have been impressed with the way the youth share about what they are learning and the impact this experience is having on their lives. There have been so many signs of hope for the future of the church here on this trip (here they call these signs scattered beams). If you see a youth from the mission trip in the month of July ask them to share a scattered beam with you so you too can see the hope for the future of the church.

Finally, the theme of this week has been, "pray as you go." We have learned that no matter the circumstances we should turn to God because we can be assured that the Lord of all creation loves and cares for us and for the world. So as we look into an uncertain future for the church perhaps this is the call for us all to pray as we go trusting that God is faithful and that nothing can separate us from the love of God.

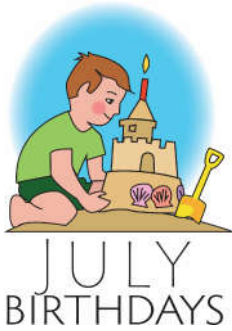


Singles Social

This is a fun fellowship! We get together once a month for a meal and Christian fellowship. If you are a single adult – divorced, widowed, or never-married, you are invited to attend!

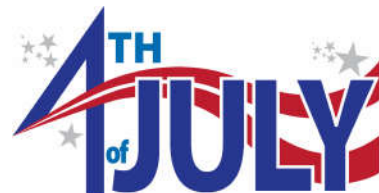

Team of Seven

Update on the Beulah - Fairfield Merger

The Team of Seven (Four Elders from Fairfield's Session and Three from Beulah's) have been meeting faithfully and prayerfully for a number of months now. They have reported their findings to both of their respective bodies and are recommending a full merger between the two congregations. The congregations will have a "family gathering" on Sunday August 7th following the 11:00 a.m. worship service. A picnic lunch will be served and the details of the merger will be presented to both congregations together and questions will be received and answers will be given.

On September 18th both congregations will meet concurrently but vote individually on the actions required to make the merger a reality. Upon approval of both congregations, the next step in the approval process goes to the Trustees of the Presbytery of the James for their assent. The final step of approval then will take place at the October meeting of the Presbytery of the James.

The Committee of Seven, the Session of Beulah Presbyterian Church and the Session of the Fairfield Presbyterian Church all have concluded that this merger is a win - win situation which will greatly strengthen the mission and ministry of Jesus Christ in Hanover County, Virginia. If you have questions, please feel free to call Steve and if he doesn't have the answer, he will find the right person who will.

(Please be sure to read the report from Stewardship and Finance below, which covers the financial implications of the merger.)

Financial Perspective

The Committee of Seven (4 elders from Fairfield and 3 elders from Beulah) are continuing to meet to discern what is best for the two congregations. But there was some preliminary work way before this group met. It was something that took place back in the year 2015. The Finance Committee was presented with the "what if" proposal concerning the possible merger of Fairfield and Beulah from only a "financial" side. We all thought that it would be good to possibly join congregations especially offering the Beulah congregation more activities and offering the Fairfield congregation a chance to grow and reach out to a wider community.

As Finance looked at the past several years of financial reports, we could see that Beulah was going to face financial issues if they continued on as they were. But we looked at a congregation that would bring us financial resources along with property that is in immaculate condition and is debt free. We saw that taking on this merger from strictly financial eyes, was a win-win. We would be helping the Beulah congregation and it would not negatively impact us at all financially. Instead, it would be positive. We thought we could earmark funds coming over in the merger to be used if there were costs incurred on the property. Plus we saw that we would be getting property that we could lease, sell or use in our program. So there could very well be additional funds coming in that could be used to maintain the property or even to increase our reserves if the property is sold in the future. Plus we would be gaining members that would be contributing to our budget and these extra funds would be there if we had costs. We thought the merger would not increase our costs very much as we have staff and facilities, so additional funds would be there for our budget. So from a financial side, the merger of Fairfield and Beulah would be a win-win situation. Plus we would become a stronger church with the addition of the Beulah members and what they can add to our ministry.

So as the Committee of Seven keeps working to bring reports to both congregations on future actions, pray for both congregations. And be assured that this would be a strong financial move for both. If you have questions related to the financial side of the merger, please contact any member of the Finance Committee and they will be happy to discuss.

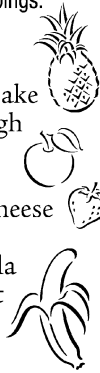
SUMMER FRUIT PIZZA

5. Slice and enjoy!

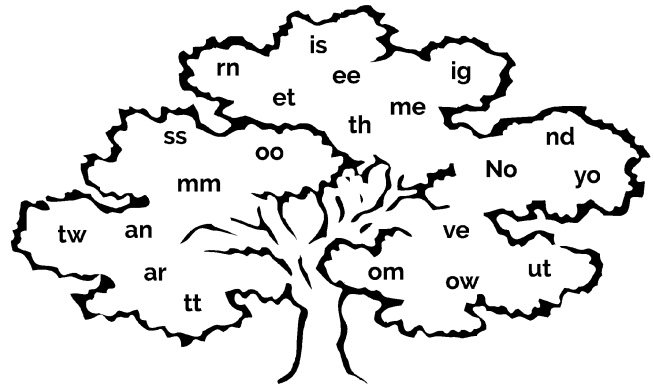
