Dear friends,
The post Easter experience of the new born Christian Church was a time of great change, uncertainty and

discomfort. But we live as the testimony to their faithfulness in working through that interim period between the earthly ministry of Jesus Christ and the firm establishment of Christianity.

That type of experience is often referred to as a "tabernacle" period. Tabernacle is an old word that we usually associate with large structure for worship but it actually stems from the root word meaning tent. For the Hebrew people the tabernacle hearkens them to their nomadic existence before they were able to build a temple. It was an interim period where they were seeking to faithfully follow their God no matter where He led them.

I admire the people of Fairfield who carried us through the "tabernacle" period of our life. The time between leaving the sanctuary on Harvie Road and before we had this wonderful facility on Cold Harbor Road. I don't imagine it was an easy time. Sharing space with a nursery school; setting up chairs and tables and then having to take them down immediately after; really having no place to call our home: all of these factors and many more must have made that a challenging time. Yet, because of the faithfulness of that band of brothers and sisters, we are where we are today! They lived with the less than ideal because they truly believed they were called to minister and serve here in Hanover County. I am sure there were more

than a few times when even the most stalwart among them longed for their old sanctuary. Still because of their faith and their faithfulness, Fairfield has prospered and grown and has become a source of blessing to many, many people to the Glory of God.

A few years ago, the idea of a contemporary service as a second service was dreamed about and brought into fruition. It was hoped that it would reach folks who were less comfortable with traditional worship and music. The dream is now our reality. But that reality has turned into more than we dreamed. The contemporary service has grown to where the attendance has stretched our capacity to worship in our sanctuary.

The Session has decided that in order to fulfill our calling to be a welcoming congregation, we need to spend some more time in the Family Center. We are all aware that this is not ideal. The contemporary service is in a "tabernacle" period. The good news is that because of that wonderful group of people who moved from Harvie Road to the nursery school, we have seen their faithfulness rewarded. As we now move through this interim period, we do so with the same desire to be faithful. I trust that the God who has provided in the past will care for us in this period and into the future He has already planned for us.

A Good God Dilemma

We have a very good dilemma here at Fairfield. We have a worship service that is growing. For most churches in the nation, Presbyterian or otherwise, this is not the norm. We are in a fortunate minority. The dilemma is that we have effectively outgrown our sanctuary. In so many ways this is evidence of God at work here at Fairfield. About a month ago I went to coffee with a retired minister from this presbytery and he was visibly shocked by the fact that we had a service that was growing. He said to me that we should be very grateful because it is the only one that he has heard of in his many conversations with other pastors. The idea that we are the only ones in this situation may be hyperbole, but it emphasizes the fact that we are in a unique and special place to be seeing growth. We don't know what the future holds for this service and the session is working hard to figure out potential options for the future. Whatever may come, we need to recognize the great gift and great responsibility that comes with welcoming more and more folks in our community into the church.

As long as God continues to send folks our way, we want to be a church that is welcoming to those who are our guests in worship. At present, that we are hearing that from guests and members alike how they have found it uncomfortable to find seating on certain Sundays in the sanctuary. Looking from a guest's perspective at least one Sunday a month we have the dilemma of overcrowding in the sanctuary. No one thinks that the Family Center is an ideal location for worship. We have pointed out positives in the past to try and help ease this needed provisional transition. The reality is that the session feels a move to the Family Center is the best temporary solution. Change is inevitable at this point if we want to remain welcoming to potential members of our family. What form these changes take long term is still up in the air and a matter for deep prayer and discernment as we go forward together.

An Easter Prayer


Dear Heavenly Father,

This is how God showed his love among us: He sent his one and only Son into the world that we might live through him. (1 John 4:9)





Under-Age Thinking...

CROSS CRAFT

Make this special cross as a reminder of Jesus' death and resurrection.



What you need:

- Adult help
- Piece of wood
- 5 nails
- Hammer
- 2 balls of yarn (blue and yellow)

What you do:

1. Hammer the nails into the wood to form a cross shape (see example).
2. Tie the blue yarn to the bottom nail. Wrap it up and around the top nail and back down to the bottom nail. Then wrap it around the middle nail and around the side nails. Repeat until the yarn is wrapped about halfway up the exposed nails.
3. Repeat step two with the yellow yarn. Wrap it around the nails until only the heads are visible.
