I know that Darren will take wonderful care of you all in my absence.

The other thing I need to say is that when it

comes time for Darren to take a sabbatical, please don't follow my example with him. One of the reasons that I felt that an extended sabbatical wasn't necessary for me was because of the fact that in 2009, I was the recipient of a Lilly Foundation grant to take a wonderful sabbatical that year. That time away may very well have kept me in the ministry at a time when I was exhausted. But I didn't think ten years later that I needed such an experience again. Darren should take the full three months so that he might be renewed and refreshed for the next leg of his pastoral journey. Please keep that in mind when his time rolls around.
