Dear friends.

I had an interesting conversation with a friend who worships in one of the many congregations who use our public schools on Sunday for worship and education. I asked how their church was doing and whether they were getting

closer to having their own space for worship and service. His answer surprised me just a bit. He told me that the congregation was doing just fine but they had no interest whatsoever in having a building of their own. He explained that they liked being itinerants who came and went as they pleased with no building to worry about.

At first thought, I wondered if maybe they were right. But then I considered our facility. Just a week or two ago, I was privileged to host a statewide gathering of Firefighters, EMS personnel and law enforcement Officers in our Family Center. We were gathered to listen to a presentation on how to reduce the number of suicides among first responders. (They are number two behind our military for rates of suicide!) It was an outstanding presentation and it will be making a positive impact in the future throughout our Commonwealth. Hosting it here and my being able to address the assembled group in some small way communicated that Fairfield Presbyterian Church and the Christian Church in general care about those who serve us. In some small way we witnessed to the Good News of Jesus' love for all people.

Time and time again, this facility of ours is such a blessing to so many. We host so many different opportunities to serve our community and to share the love of God in ever so subtle ways. I would really have to look at a calendar of activities to tell you how many different groups and individuals use our rooms to celebrate, to weep together, to learn together, to serve together. Groups as varied as Caritas to the Boy Scouts to Stop Hunger Now to Firefighters to Moms and Dads and Sons and Daughters! This space is such a blessing and such an avenue of service and outreach to our community.

I am afraid, I can't agree with my friend and the congregation he worships with. We are blessed with a wonderful facility in a wonderful location and we are using it to bring glory to God. I for one am very grateful that the folks who came before me had the wisdom, insight and courage to hear God's call to serve Jesus Christ in and through this place on Cold Harbor Road. Thanks be to God for their faithfulness which allows us to be faithful in this time and in this place!



This summer, put your best foot forward by brightening up a pair of flip-flops.


#### What you need:
