Dear friends,

Joseph, when he was in his forced exile, was called upon bv Pharaoh to interpret a recurring dream.

strange dream involved 7 fat cows and 7 skinny cows. It seemed guite obvious to Joseph that the dream was a warning to prepare for a famine which would befall the kingdom. The Pharaoh listened and they prepared through the 7 good years for the 7 bad years. (Read Genesis 41 for the full story.)

I keep thinking there is a serious lesson here for us as a congregation. I'm not predicting a famine but I do know that congregations have peaks and valleys in their corporate lives. Churches have their ups and downs. We all know that. But how do we handle that insight? I think it may be a fairly simple process. Let me explain.

Fairfield is in a very good place in our congregation's life. By all measures we are doing well. I know that I for one am very grateful for the blessings we are enjoying here. But, as the Bible reminds us, to whom much is given - much is required. The advice I am giving to the leadership of the Church is this: we who are greatly blessed need to prepare for the future when Fairfield may go through some times of struggle. Your Stewardship Team is endeavoring to find ways to encourage each of us to do our part in building an Endowment for Fairfield. Obviously, we hope that any of our members would seriously consider listing our church family in their will. There are other options and opportunities as well that any of the Stewardship

Team or Darren or I would be happy to share with you.

But the point I am sharing with you is this: churches with endowments are able to weather hard times and in good times they are able to do even more. Churches without endowments. when they hit the hard times, struggle mightily because they end up doing little more than keeping the doors open and the lights on. Newcomers to their communities visit once and see no ministry or mission and walk away to another congregation. The endowed church, however has the resources to keep the building in repair and to fund mission and ministry and therefore gets through the tough times quicker because they maintain an attractive ministry and mission which draws newcomers to their church

We'll talk more about this but I wanted to let you know what we were thinking about!


Joyful Reader's Circle

Notes from your Session

- Steve reported that he had a very beneficial study leave and accomplished what he hoped he would. He and Darren are taking a class co-sponsored by the Seminary and the Presbytery on Evangelism of the Nones and Dones. He also told of the excitement of the start of the second season of Compass Sports in January.
- Darren led a thought provoking discussion on the book Growing Young which is aimed to help us to attract and disciple the next generation. He also talked about the improvements to the sound system in the Family Center as well as updating us on the progress of the Pray for Me program which will support our youth through having adults committed to praying for them.
- Brett was delighted to tell us that he will be starting his new ministry at New Covenant Presbyterian Church in Chesterfield. He will be examined by the Presbytery on October 21st and if the way be clear will be ordained by the Presbytery in our sanctuary on October 29th!
- Stewardship reported several items of good news for us. We are in good financial shape heading into the fall as income has exceeded expenses in the first eight months. They also reported that our mortgage principal has fallen below \$500,000.00 and that we have been able to increase our emergency reserves in the past few years.
- Facility Management was happy with that good news and are now happy to proceed with a few of their projects, most notably, painting the exterior windows on the street side of the original building. Being good stewards, they are looking into reducing our garbage expenses in light of our increased recycling program!
- Nominations/Personnel has been diligently praying and discerning whom God is calling to serve in leadership roles for the next classes of Elders and Deacons as well as other offices.
- · Adult Discipleship was pleased to report the

- success of the four night adult VBS class on Romans. They were equally pleased that there has been a good response to the fall small group study. The fifth Sunday class/fellowship opportunity will be one where we will get to put the scripture passage into practice!
- Children's Nurture excitedly reported that the new Sunday School format has been met with a very good response! The new format involves greater participation and is closely coordinated with Steve and Darren's sermons. The Gingerbread Cottage Preschool has begun their new year sharing our facilities and there have been no issues.
- Team Youth noted the success of the summer mission trip and are already making plans for the next trip. Confirmation Class will start in January and they are looking at offering a second class for older youth who missed earlier opportunities to join the Church. They were grateful that the fall start up of Youth Group was off on a very good foot!
- Evangelism and Community Outreach reminded us of the upcoming Fall-O-Ween program on Saturday October 28th. They are looking for willing hands to participate in making this year's event as successful as last years. (Talk to Bill Lythgoe or Angela Blue if you can give some of your time!)
- Missions and Christian Witness are thrilled that MCEF will be opening their new One Stop Shop for those in need of a helping hand. Their ribbon cutting ceremony will be on November 12, 2017. They asked for and received the blessing of the Elders to continue our participation in Operation Christmas Child!



Make this sign to hang on your wall as a daily reminder of God's amazing gift of grace.




What you need:


