Gratitude is a noun. Merriam-Webster defines it as "the state of being grateful." How do you get into a state of being? For us Virginians it may be

harder to relate to states of anything since we are a commonwealth. None the less, to be in a state of being grateful seems like a way of life not a passing emotion. I am feeling thankful today means you might be feeling selfish or stingy tomorrow. There seems to be a difference between concentrating our efforts for a big day once a year called Thanksgiving and living in a state of gratitude. Are we just born in a state of gratitude? What keeps us from being people of gratitude or moves us into a state of gratitude?

We are in the middle of a sermon series called the enemies of gratitude which is intended to help us understand things that keep us from being people of gratitude. The five topics are nostalgia, worry, entitlement. greed and disappointment. The last three will actually be in the month of November. What has struck me as I have been looking at the texts and themes of this series is that gratitude has everything to do with trust and grace. Grace is our understanding that everything is a gift. Life, breath, skills, loved-ones, and on and on. It is all a gift. Those of us who have been called into relationship with Jesus Christ also recognize that the giver of the gift is an unending source of faithful love. Always pulling us deeper and deeper into goodness. The gift giver is one who can be trusted, one in whom

we can put our full faith and trust. We can come to a state of gratitude when we come more and more to recognize that everything is a gift from a loving God who we can trust completely.

How do we come to trust in God? How do we believe God is love? Perhaps this is where we are called to do a little work in order to move closer to a state of gratitude. First, we need to find ways to remind ourselves of all the gifts we have been given. Some people have a practice of taking note everyday of a few things for which they are grateful. Some of us need this daily jolt out of self-sufficiency and naval gazing to truly appreciate the gift of our life. Second, we should not only remind ourselves, but we should also thank God for the gifts we have received. Even more, we can pray to be shown more and more of God's love and goodness toward us. I am not suggesting that we ask God for the new car for which we will then be grateful, but that we simply ask, "Open my eyes to your loving kindness." It also does not hurt to show appreciation to those in our lives for whom we are grateful. Hopefully, trying some of these practices and of course coming to hear the sermons will help with our gratitude. Perhaps this November we can move beyond a brief pit stop at a place called Thanksgiving and begin to move into the state of gratitude



Notes from your Session

- Darren opened the meeting with devotions and teaching focusing our attention on the importance of young people and young adults in the whole life of the Church.
- In the midst of the Session meeting, we suspended our work and met as the annual meeting of the Board of Trustees of Fairfield Presbyterian Church of Hanover County, VA, Inc. During this meeting, J.R. Marker was elected President of the Corporation, Gene Rosen was elected Treasurer and Fran Hansbrough was elected Secretary. We then resumed our work as Church Elders.
- Due to the massive needs following the rash of natural disasters, it was voted to give the Thanksgiving Day offering to the One Great Hour of sharing for their work with the Presbyterian Disaster Assistance.
- Voted to receive Wyatt Wills as a member.
- Discussed having a special meeting of the Session in January to brain storm and plan for the future of Fairfield Presbyterian Church.
- Learned that Confirmation class will run from January 7th until Pentecost. We also learned that a second class will be offered to a group of older young men who for a variety of reasons weren't able to attend Confirmation in their Middle School years.
- Received the Treasurer's report that we are doing financially well, coming through the summer months with a small surplus!
- Approved the Challenge Budget proposed by the Stewardship team with an overall increase of 3.2%.
- Changed the procedure for 2018 for salary adjustments to include more input directly from the Personnel Committee.
- Voted to move \$15,000 from the Historic Beulah Presbyterian reserves to establish the Beulah Presbyterian Church Endowment Fund (as per our merger agreement). The income from these funds will be used for Evangelism and Outreach through Fairfield Church. There remains a more than sufficient amount in the reserves to maintain the

- Historic Beulah Church building. The reserve fund for the Cemetery is also intact and held solely for the upkeep and maintenance of Beulah's cemetery.
- Were reminded that the Endowment Fund development is still a priority but we will hear more about it after the Fall Stewardship Campaign.
- Established a small task force made up of members of Facilities Management and Stewardship to analyze the positives and the negatives should a contiguous property become available for purchase.
- Established a small fee for the use of the Family Center to cover the direct expenses of an event coordinator who will oversee the set up and clean up by outside groups using the room.
- Established a security deposit to be held until the facility is acceptably returned to a clean and useable space when used by outside groups.
- We were uplifted by the reports of the success of the new Sunday School format with more children and parents involved, the establishment of a Youth Praise Band, the excitement and numbers of those involved in the puppet ministry and the new leadership for the younger children's choir!
- Celebrated that our Kid's Clothing Exchange was again not only a huge success with over 6000 pieces of clothing exchange but also that the new format made the effort easier and more enjoyable for those involved.
- Were reminded that we are hoping for wonderful participation again this year for the Fall-o-ween program. This is a wonderful service to our community and ties together food, fellowship, entertainment, trunk or treats and of course our hay ride.
- Learned that the new One Stop Shop of MCEF is working very well and that there will be an open house/ grand opening at a later date.
- Rejoiced that our gift to the Capital Campaign of Camp Hanover was gratefully received and that they are progressing well toward their goal.

- Were updated on the progress of the Mission Trip to Jacksonville, FL and learned that there still are more spaces available and anyone interested should contact Tracy Young as soon as possible.
- Were excited to learn that the Youth Mission Trip for 2018 will also be going to Jacksonville, FL with more details to come later.

The MCEF One Stop Shop (OSS) has been open for three weeks and things are going well.

What you need:

- Jar
- Ribbon
- Scissors
- Glue
- 3 sheets of paper (different colors)
- Marker or pen



- 1. Measure and cut enough ribbon to wrap around the jar's neck, below the lid. Glue in place and let dry.
- 2. Fold each piece of paper in half three times, resulting in eight rectangles per sheet. Cut along the fold lines, and you'll have 24 rectangles.
- 3. Each day in November until Thanksgiving, write down one blessing from God. Then place that blessing in the jar.
- 4. On Thanksgiving, open the jar and read all your blessings to your family and friends.




Under-Age Thinking...




