Dear friends,

I want to thank all of you who took part in the Pray For Me campaign. I have heard a number of comments about how meaningful this experience was for those praying and especially for the parents of those being prayed for. I know that I have felt the power of this experience as I prayed for my partners and as I imagined my oldest son being prayed for. Know that even if you never got a chance to meet the youth that you were praying for that your prayers have been deeply important in their lives.

In this New Year, I would ask that you continue to keep the young person you were given in your prayers. If you like you can go back through the book and keep a more formal prayer structure for your young person. If you are like me you could probably string a week or two together of prayers that you missed along the way. Don't let them hide their light behind shyness and fear. Create in them courage to do works of love, kindness, mercy and justice so that the world might be captured by your greatness. Awaken them to new ways that they can serve you and mankind that would exalt your name and goodness on earth. Give them insight on how to help others join in the joy of serving and glorifying you through their good works. May you be praised forever, in Jesus' name, amen.


