
I think what I am trying to say to you is that as Christians we are called to use all of our gifts and talents to the best of our abilities. Work hard, strive for the greater good, seize all the

Anne Baird has moved to apartment C-226 at Covenant Woods. Please make the change in your directory!





CARITASCongregations Around Richmond To Assure Shelter

If you are new to the concept of CARITAS you will get a chance to experience it first hand as Fairfield hosts up to 32 men in our Family Center October 13-20, 2018. CARITAS is the largest and most inclusive emergency shelter in central Virginia. It began in the mid-1980's in response to the growing need to provide emergency shelter to homeless adults during the cold winter months. Today, it has grown to a year-round, full-service shelter program for both single adults and families.

In early September a sign-up board will begin to be displayed in our church. This is a place where you can volunteer to help in a variety of ways while the men are our guests. The men sleep in our Family Ccenter and enjoy the comfort and safety of being off the street. We, as a church provide their meals – breakfast, bag lunch and dinner and any other comforts that can be provided during their stay. We are especially fortunate to have showers for them to use. Below is an idea of how the week goes so you can find a spot where you can help.

Saturday, October 13. The sleeping mats, sheets, pillows, blankets and client possessions arrive via CARITAS truck. Help will needed unloading and setting up the family center. A great place for all ages to help.

Saturday the 13th dinner through breakfast on Saturday 20th we will be feeding the guests Breakfast that is generally cereal, fruit, juice and coffee and snack items that are less sugary. They leave early each day. The Mission Fund usually provides these breakfast items. Lunches each day are a bagged lunch with the usual fare plus a bottle of water. Families, classes and groups furnish and pack these lunches and bring them to the church. We have been lucky enough to have the bottled water donated in years past. Dinners each evening are a hot meal and dessert furnished and prepared by families, scouts, classes and groups in the church. This meal is served by the group that prepares the meal so you get to meet and talk with our guests. Cleanup is also appreciated.

Once each week we do laundry for those who need it. Families sign up to take a bag of laundry home with them and bring back clean and folded the next day. Church members sign up to spend the night in the church who, along with the CARITAS personnel who spends the night, can field any emergencies (very rare). This overnight volunteer also puts out the breakfast in the morning.

On the 20th, after they leave, the CARITAS truck arrives, and we load up the mats, dirty linen, and any possessions. On to the next location. Another great time for volunteers of all ages.

If you have any questions about Fairfield hosting CARITAS this fall I encourage you to speak to Steve or Darren or ask any member of the Mission Committee. This is a wonderful ministry and a meaningful way to connect with these guests.
