Dear friends,

We recently received a letter from an annuity company letting us know that Janie Harrington made us a partial beneficiary of

her annuity. Somehow, that didn't surprise me. Janie and her late husband were faithful members of Fairfield Church since they joined in 1951. Both were former members of Methodist churches: she nearby and he from Upstate NY, but both found a home and a family here at Fairfield Presbyterian. Janie never flagged in her love of God and of this Church.

It seems so appropriate and right that she remembered us with this bequest. While it wasn't a numerically large one, it is nonetheless a very impactful one. With the \$13,768.98 she left to us, we will establish the Janie Harrington Fund as a part of our Endowment Fund. Income from that fund will help us to continue the mission and ministry of Fairfield Church. But I would have to say that in some very tangible way, the more important aspect of this is that the generations who follow us will have some sense and appreciation for the members of this congregation who came before them.

In the historic language of the Church, it is expressed that no one ceases to be a member of the Church. Theologians speak of the Church Militant for those of us who still work for the Kingdom here on earth and speak of the Church Triumphant for those who have gone before us into the Heavenly realm. But together we are the

Church of Jesus Christ. Remembering the generations who have been promoted to glory is a very important reminder to us that what we are involved in is not bound by time but is timeless. We all stand on the shoulders of those who have gone before us. We all prepare the way for those who will follow.

I am glad that 100 years from now the people of Fairfield Church will remember Janie Harrington and so many others who have helped shape this congregation to be the special church it is.

If you'd like to make sure someone special is remembered and you want to make sure we leave behind a financially strong church for the coming generations, please talk to me or any of our Stewardship Team.

- Enthusiastically supported the Adult Discipleship Team on their plans to hold the Adult Vacation Bible School July 15, 16, 17th. 

Under-Age Thinking...




Summer is the perfect time to gaze at the wonders in the sky. Make this craft as a reminder of God's handiwork — including you!

What you need:

- Glass jar
- Permanent marker
- Glue (and water)
- Paper plate
- Paintbrush
- Star sequins
- Battery-operated tea light

What you do:

- 1. Around the jar's opening, write in permanent marker: Shine ... like stars in the sky. Philippians 2:15
- 2. Pour some glue on the plate. Thin with some water.
- 3. "Paint" the outside of the jar with glue and then sprinkle on some sequins. Let dry.
- 4. Add the tea light and give your bedroom a starry glow at nighttime.
