September is full of all kinds of transitions and most regrettable is the end of summer. While most of us have been continuing

our regular work weeks throughout the summer, things just seem a little different. The return of Fall means figuring out the kids' schedules and how we are going to make them work. Going back to school or work for students, teachers and educators. We get busy. This month our sermon series asked us to think about work, but hopefully not in the same stress producing way the end of summer does.

A Faith That Works is the sermon series for September and it is an investigation of the book of James. Usually in Protestant circles, we don't get around to looking at the book of James because it seems to contradict our emphasis on faith with an emphasis on works. The truth is the book offers us very practical advice about how to put our faith into action. This should be an inspiring series that will help us move into the Fall walking closer to God not just in our minds but as our whole selves.

"The book of James stands unique in the New Testament for its no-nonsense, practical, proverbial wisdom. There is very little cryptic language or mysterious imagery in the way that it calls people to live out their discipleship. For James, faith is neither radically privatized nor solely personal. It is to be expressed outwardly, to improve one's relationships with others and to help those in need. This series challenges those in a congregation who believe that faith is something that should be kept to one's self and challenges a culture that sees very little value in

religion at all." *

Our memory verse for this month is typical of the kinds of challenges and themes that come up in the book of James. James 2:14-17:

What good is it, my brothers and sisters, if you say you have faith but do not have works? Can faith save you? If a brother or sister is naked and lacks daily food, and one of you says to them, "Go in peace; keep warm and eat your fill," and yet you do not supply their bodily needs, what is the good of that? So, faith by itself, if it has no works, is dead."

We hope you will be able to join us in worship for this series and encourage you to take some time each week to look at a chapter of the book of James which is just five short chapters.





If you prefer to do your own shopping for the pantry, whatever you can share is always appreciated. In the month of July, the OSS served 197 households distributing 310 bags of food.

The next day to contribute food for the food pantry is Sunday, September 2nd.

To give you an idea of the bagged lunch schedule please note the following:

- October 13 Fairfield will drop off 64 bagged lunches to cover lunch on 10/14 and 10/15
- October 15 Fairfield will drop off 64 bagged lunches to cover lunch on 10/16 and 10/17
- October 17 Fairfield will drop off 64 bagged lunches to cover lunch on 10/18 and 10/19
- October 19 Fairfield will drop off 32 bagged lunches to cover lunch on 10/20

This is the same schedule of 32 lunches per day, but they will be brought to the church on a different schedule than in years past. The sign up will make it clear when each group will bring their lunches to the church. There will also be a place to sign up for lunch delivery.



The lunches consist of a sandwich, chips, fruit, dessert, bottled water and a napkin. The Mission Committee will supply bottled water and the lunch bags.






