In the Christian tradition, we open November with All Saint's Day. The observance of

this day goes back to the 4th century and developed out of the long tradition of honoring and remembering those who were models of and martyrs for the faith. Typically, November makes us think of Thanksgiving Day or at least the idea of thanksgiving. I want to suggest that this month we combine the two in a way that honors those who have shown us how to be faithful Christians as we remember and give thanks for their lives.

All Saint's Day is grounded in the idea of the communion of saints. The communion of saints is one of the beliefs that we affirm in the Apostle's Creed. The idea develops out of the recognition that God has been reaching out to humanity from creation and we humans are able to experience and know God's love. The communion of saints in its broadest sense invites us to be a part of the family of those who seek to respond to God's love in the past, present and future; on earth as in heaven; now and forever. In a very real sense every time we gather around the communion table, we are celebrating All Saint's Day. It is in the celebration of the Lord's Supper that we are remembering Jesus the Christ. On one hand, we are remembering the deep sacrificial love of Jesus who gave his life to bring us into relationship with God. At the same time, we are symbolically bringing all of the members of Christ's body together again around our Lord's table. Re-membering Christ's body,

those physically present in the pews and those saints who form the great cloud of witnesses feasting with us in the fullness of God's presence. For, as theologian Elizabeth Johnson reminds us, those in God's family who die "fall into the hands of the living God" to be "quickened by the loving-kindness which is forever faithful." The love of God in Christ Jesus creates an extended "community of grace" those who have died, those living in hope, and those yet to be born: "all seekers of the divine, in a circle around the eucharistic table, the body of Christ which encompasses the earth itself."

This year we have lost some great saints of this church and of Christ's body on earth, but we can be thankful for their witness and their continued presence with us in the communion of saints. As we gather around the eucharist (thanksgiving) table on the 4th and as we gather around the Thanksgiving table on the 22nd let's not forget the saints who have gone before us. Let us give thanks for their lives and witness. Let them inspire us to lives of greater faith so that we may be an inspiration to those who surround us now and those who will come after us. Let these words from Hebrews 12 be our guide: "Therefore, since we are surrounded by so great a cloud of witnesses, let us also lay aside every weight and the sin that clings so closely, and let us run with perseverance the race that is set before us, looking to Jesus the pioneer and perfecter of our faith."



Session Notes October 2018

Your Session was quite busy when they met this month. During our time together we were able to:

- renew the rental contract with Grace United Family Church for their use of the Historic Beulah Church for the year 2019 at the same monthly rate. It was noted that the Grace United Family Church has made numerous improvements to the building including adding insulation to the attic areas at their own expense. They have been model tenants and we are glad they are using the Historic Beulah Church for the purposes it was intended.
- made note that we have not yet dedicated the historical marker which was placed on the property of Historic Beulah Church. This will be done in a timely manner as soon as a mutually agreeable date can be found to do so in cooperation with Grace United Family Church.
- extend the shared space agreement with the New Beginnings Church after its trial period was completed. We extended their agreement of shared space/shared expenses through the end of 2019 at the same rate. It was noted by all the Elders that the relationship has been a very positive one and we are glad they are here with us.
- note that Gingerbread Cottage Preschool will be completing their time with us at the end of the current school year. They will be "returning" to the new Shalom Baptist Church next fall. We noted that they have been wonderful tenants and we will miss the joyful sounds they brought to our building.
- receive the Treasurer's report gratefully noting that we ended September in very good shape as we continue to solidify our finances and plan for the future of the Fairfield Congregation.
- approve the asking budget for 2019. We are looking at a very modest increase overall of less that 2.5%. The Stewardship Campaign for 2019 will be held during the month of November.
- rejoice with the Nominations Committee that their work is progressing well and ahead of schedule. When their work is complete a meeting of the Congregation will be called to receive and act upon their recommendations.
- charge the Personnel Committee with the responsibility to review the salaries of our staff for the year 2019.
- be happy to hear about Adult Discipleship's plan for the Fall Small Group study on the topic of prayer. One group will meet Monday evenings and another will meet on Thursday evenings.
- rejoice with the Children's Nurture Team that Sunday School with its new hands on curriculum was showing growth and vitality in that ministry. A number of the children have been enthusiastically learning memory verses from the Bible!
- hear that the Clothing Swap was very successful with a wonderful group of volunteers from Fairfield. Its numbers were down by 10% but that is still excellent since several churches in the area have copied our model for doing this mission. The Butterfly Babies Mission accepted all of the "left over" donations of children's clothing.
- learn from Evangelism that the new women's Bible Study has been very well received as an outreach to non-members as well as a few of our members. The numbers have been much higher than hoped for and the enthusiasm of the participants is very high as well.
- endorse the plan to invite Nicole Unice to be a keynote speaker at a women's event that will be an outreach to our community. This will take place sometime in 2019. It was thought that Evangelism money from the Beulah Church fund will be able to make this possible.
- be delighted to know that congregational participation with the new program to support Caritas has been very good. Both the lunch provisions and the towel drive were very well supported.




