Or Advent. If you look this word up in a dictionary (or online!) you will find a definition along the

lines of "the arrival of an important person, activity, or event." It is often used for an epoch of time such as the advent of the internet or the advent of television. For the Christian Church Year, it is the new beginning. It is an acknowledgment that all things celebrated in the fellowship of the Christian family has its origin in the incarnation of Jesus Christ!

This truth is so important that the Church celebrates a whole season of Advent - to prepare for the arrival of the most important person ever to walk the surface of this planet! To commemorate the arrival of the One who is proclaimed as the King of King and Lord of Lords is something so momentous that a single day or even twelve days (the traditional 12 days of Christmas) is absolutely insufficient!

It is a time of preparing the way for the full celebration of Christmas, certainly! But it is also our opportunity for a new beginning - to take stock of ourselves and our faith journey. Don't get so caught up in the whirlwind of activity in this season that you miss out on the wonderful opportunity of seeing anew the miracle that took place in a tiny backwater town called Bethlehem of Judaea.



Library News:


"For God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in Him may not perish but may have eternal life." John 3:16

Mechanicsville Churches Emergency Functions (MCEF)www.4mcef.com One Stop Shop (OSS)

December - pasta sauce

If you prefer to do your own shopping for the pantry, whatever you can share is always appreciated. The pantry needs include applesauce, protein beans, rice in one lb. bag or smaller.

THE NEXT DAY TO CONTRIBUTE FOOD FOR THE FOOD PANTRY IS SUNDAY, DECEMBER 2

The One Stop Shop activity during the month of October:

- Total sign ins 197 (representing 628 persons in the households)
- Total new clients 14
- Total # bags of food given out 315 (includes 57 Thanksgiving Bags)
- Total #bags of clothing (all ages) 81
- Total # bags of linens 15

For these counts we use the brown grocery bags with handles. A family of 1-2 receives one bag of groceries and a family of 3 or more receives 2 bags.

Closet needs: bath towels, hand towels, washcloths, queen size sheets

- Only WINTER clothing is now being accepted for men and women. Children's summer and winter clothes can be accepted provided there is enough room in their closet at MCEF. We are concentrating of winter clothing but kids grow so fast we accept summer too.
- After the first of the year there will be new guidelines for clothing and linen donations.
 Unfortunately, many inappropriate donations are coming in and it is overloading the sorting team that looks at every item. MCEF is not able to use many of the donations which is sad. Remember that MCEF <u>CAN</u> accept clean, gently used, sized clothing for the family. No fancy clothes, no suits, no household items, no shoes.

Many times, non-profits become a dumping ground for unwanted, dirty clothing that can not be used by anyone. MCEF tries to provide a sense of dignity for those who find themselves in need of what this non-profit offers.

As we come to year's end a huge **THANK YOU** goes out to all who have supported MCEF in

2018. The work of this non-profit couldn't be accomplished without the help of the Mechanicsville Community.

A Merry Balance

In Luke 10: 38-42, Martha gets a bad rap. After all, we need Marthas to get things done and to show hospitality. (Note that Martha is the one who opens up her home to Jesus in the first place!)

Marthas are needed in December, but holiday preparations shouldn't shift our focus from the reason for the season. When we become "worried and distracted" as Martha did (v. 41, NRSV), we're tempted to trade God's "one thing" (v. 42) for the world's many worthless things. Yet if we're only like Mary, we may forget to let the world know who we're celebrating!

So this Christmas, keep a proper balance between your innter Mary and your inner Martha. Take time to "be Mary," kneeling at the manger, so that all the merry things you do as Martha have meaning and serve the newborn King.



Reconstructing the Gospel Winter Retreat


Jonathan Wilson-Hartgrove grew up in the Bible Belt of the American South as a faithful church-going Christian. But he gradually came to realize that the gospel his Christianity proclaimed was not good news for everybody. Just as Reconstruction after the Civil War worked to repair a desperately broken society, our compromised Christianity requires a spiritual reconstruction that undoes the injustices of the past. Throughout Advent a number of folks in the Presbytery of the James will be reading Jonathan's latest book *Reconstructing the Gospel: Finding Freedom from Slaveholder Religion.* Jonathan's story is powerful and at times really pushes its readers to reconsider opinions and "the way things are." In January, the presbytery will welcome Jonathan for a retreat where his Southern charm and strong testimony will help us to see where Jesus is calling us to reconstruct our gospel in these divisive times. 
