As we continue in the season of Epiphany, we will be looking at the theme of light coming in our lives in the person of Jesus Christ and how that light is meant for all the

nations. We will also continue in the gospel of Luke as our primary text of this Christian year. The last Sunday of 2018, I spoke during the Sunday School hour about how we can view Luke's gospel as more than just a historical account of the life, death and resurrection of Jesus. Each of the gospels insists that Jesus is the light that shines in the darkness and the darkness does not overcome his light. Even more, each gospel insists that Jesus is the Christ and is the first born from the dead. All of this is to say that when we read, study and seek to live out the gospel Jesus is alive and present with us.

Renowned teacher, Alexander Shaia, uses historic study and insights from the perennial tradition of spiritual guides to suggest the way Luke's gospel presents us with a living Christ calling us to mature in service to God's kingdom. As the light and life of Jesus is made manifest to us throughout the season of Epiphany, I would encourage us to think about how each text is calling us to consider our vocation as followers of Jesus, agents of God's good news in the world.

Shaia says, "Luke filled his gospel with stories of compassion and service to an extent not found in any other gospel." He suggests that central to the gospel is the conversation with the lawyer in chapter 10 which leads into the parable of the good Samaritan: ²⁵Just then a lawyer stood up to test Jesus. "Teacher," he said, "what

must I do to inherit eternal life?" ²⁶ He said to him, "What is written in the law? What do you read there?" ²⁷ He answered, "You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your strength, and with all your mind; and your neighbor as yourself." ²⁸ And he said to him, "You have given the right answer; do this, and you will live."

Shaia continues, "when we love our neighbors as we love ourselves, we are compelled to live our lives in service. This is how our transformation truly occurs, allowing the meaning and purpose of our lives to unfold."

So many people are looking for meaning in their lives, searching for something more than the nine-to-five and the non-stop news cycle that tells us how to think and with whom to be angry. Our young people desire to make a difference, but seldom see the connection between what God intends for their lives and what will help them pay back their student loans. Throughout February, Marcy Wright, our fabulous intern from Union Presbyterian Seminary will lead a Bible Study through Jesus' sermon on the plain. The study will help us focus on developing A Heart for Service. There are two opportunities to take part on Wednesday evenings at 6:00pm beginning February 6 and Sundays during the Sunday School hour beginning on the 10th. We hope you will be able to participate in this study as we move through Epiphany and prepare for Lent.

At our stated meeting in January your Elders -

- took care of some "housekeeping" duties in receiving the report filed by our Clerk and Treasurer through the Presbytery for the General Assembly. We were pleased to see that our membership has grown to 420 and that our year round average attendance stood at 208. Our school year has average was 221 with the 9:00 service averaging 112 and the 11:00 a.m. service averaging 95.
- joyfully voted to receive Myra and Dave Compton by letter of transfer.
- were delighted to hear that Steve has been asked by the Parson's Bench Publishing Co. To compile a book of sermons for publication.
- commended Facilities Management for their excellent work in both decorating the Church for Advent and Christmas and also their efforts to remove decorations and clean the Church afterward.
- rejoiced with the Stewardship Team that we ended the year with a favorable balance. That surplus will be put into our "rainy day fund" for future unplanned necessities.
- were grateful to hear that pledges have come in positively and we should meet all of our projected needs in the budget for 2019.
- thanked Adult Discipleship for their continuing good work on the Fifth Sunday gatherings. Particular commendation was given to Darren for his presentation on the Gospel of Luke.
- gave thanks to the Children's Nurture Team and Darren for the excellent job they did for the Family Service on Christmas Eve. A special thank you went to Jeff Blue who brought his guitar out of retirement and did an excellent job.
- heard of the success of the recent Paint Night and of the plans to do another.
- were delighted to hear that the outreach small group study on Nicole Unice's book has 41 women enrolled almost half of whom are not members of Fairfield.
- learned that there was a need for additional Sunday School teachers for our youngsters. If anyone would like to help out once or twice a month they are encouraged to talk to Angela Blue.
- were supportive of the Youth Group's planned mission trip to Altoona, PA this summer. They have two fundraisers planned to make this possible: a pancake breakfast on February 3 and the Talent Show on March 22nd.
- began planning for the Maundy Thursday worship service with communion and discussed the hopes of doing a Good Friday Tenebrae Service.
- appointed commissions to the February 16th Presbytery of the James meeting at Three Chopt Presbyterian Church.
- welcomed the new Elders to the table and looked forward to their ordination/installation on January 27th.

Make this valentine for a family member or friend.




What you need:














Answer: D (See Luke 5:1-11.)

Got love?

"Love ask nothing in return but seeks those who need it. And who needs our love more than those who are consumed with hatred and are utterly devoid of love?"
