Epiphany Series: A Light to Enlighten the Nations

"For my eyes have seen your salvation, which you have prepared in the presence of all peoples. a light for revelation to the Gentiles and for glory to your people Israel." These lines from the Song of Simeon (Luke 2:29-32) speak of the season of Epiphany, of the light of Christ for all the world. 

Decorate a soap bottle as a reminder of how baptism cleans us on the inside.




What you need:


