

### To God you Shall Return

The traditional Ash Wednesday words, "Remember that you are dust and to dust you shall return" might seem depressing. But in our often death-denying culture, some might find it refreshing to hear the frank statement that we can do nothing to save ourselves, physically or spiritually - that, no matter how we try to avoid sin, we can't untangle ourselves from self-interest. How liberating, then, to know that we don't have to! God loves us as we are and sent Jesus to break sin's power over us.

A pastor described Ash Wednesday as the point you can pinch in the middle of a long piece of ribbon, such that when you lift it high, the two ends - one symbolizing our baptism and the other, our funeral - meet and touch. We come from dust and will return to dust, but we also come from God and will return to God. Ash Wednesday reminds us that we're always safe in God's love.



Join us on Ash Wednesday this year, Wednesday, March 6 at 6:30 in the sanctuary. Come to a meditative service, preparing our hearts for the Lenten season, with the imposition of ashes as we set forth with Jesus on the journey to the cross.

# Notes from your Session

February proved to be a busy month for your Elders' meeting. We accomplished a great deal. In the course of our time together we:

- heard a positive report from the auditors with their thanks to Gene Rosen for his outstanding work as treasurer.
- joyfully received a report from the *Deacons* on the good work they are doing. Learned of their plans to honor the longest tenured member of this congregation. Learned of their plan to reinvigorate the homebound communion program.
- approved enthusiastically the new *photo-directory* program that will be done in house and not involve the selling of photos.
- endorsed a Boy Scout's Eagle project to renew the nature trail on our grounds.
- learned that our retention pond passed inspections for the County with some minor work needed. We thanked the Bay Group for their deeply discounted efforts on our behalf. We thanked as well Sandy's Plants for the loan of equipment needed to complete that work.
- talked about preparing for Easter and all of our guests by reviewing our signage and making improvements accordingly.
- celebrated the fifth anniversary of Darren's ordination to ministry and his five years ministering with us!
- sought volunteers to attend a Presbytery Stewardship event to be held at Three Chopt Church.
- approved the plan presented by Personnel as requested by Steve for him to take his sabbatical (under his terms of call) over three years by taking one month each year. This sabbatical plan is in addition to his regular vacation and study leave and is granted after his over seven years of continuous service to our congregation. It will have no financial implications for our church.
- learned from Adult Discipleship of their plans for the Lenten small group study of the book <u>The Cross and Prodigal</u> by Kenneth Bailey, who was a Professor of NT in two of our Middle Eastern colleges. We will meet in various homes and signup sheets will be available soon.
- heard that Steve will lead our Fifth Sunday lesson for March 31<sup>st</sup>.
- rejoiced that 20 young people and adults will be travelling to Altoona, PA the week after school finishes to do *mission work* there in that financially depressed community.
- were touched to learn that a generous donor has given us money to do an outreach program
  to bring more people to worship this Easter.
- discussed the possibility of doing an early morning Sunday chapel service as an outreach to
  the community for those whose schedules make it difficult for them to attend worship regularly.
  This would be a matins service with communion and held in the Union Classroom, if the
  Session deems it worthy.
- concluded our evening by joyfully approving the reception and baptism of Stephen Sheldon, step brother of Elder Wyatt Wills.


Play this game to remember when God made each of his masterpieces.




