September is here and for many that means summer is over and it is time to get back to a different routine. For the church, September is sometimes considered a new start to our church year even though it does not have the same theological grounding as Advent and the beginning of the Christian Year. This

September there are a couple of chances for new beginnings and re-commitments around Fairfield. We can start with a reminder of our Worship +2 initiative. We encourage everyone to come to worship as frequently as possible as a foundation and then add two other elements: 1) Seek out one way to be of service to folks in the church or community. 2) Find a way to be nurtured through Christian education offerings or even Christian yoga. Already in September we have opportunities available for you to participate in Worship +2.

On September 8th, all of our Sunday school offerings will be available and we encourage you to find a class that can nurture you. There are four different classes for adults that meet at 10 every Sunday and offerings for children and youth. In addition, we have other classes in the works that might be of interest to you as well. Give Sunday school a try in September. Also beginning September 8th, Connect women's ministry will be back in full swing on Sunday evenings from 4:30-5:30. Connect is a Ladies Bible Study (and so much more!) and this fall the study is based on the book "40 Verses to Ignite your Faith" by Lorie Polich Short. In addition, all women are invited out on September 25th for Fearless. Fearless will be an evening with renown women's author, Nicole Unice. This would be a great multi-generational event to invite mothers, daughters, grandmothers, granddaughters, etc. You can find more information about women's ministry events on the website.

In celebration of those who have been worshiping, serving and learning at Fairfield for 50 years or more, the deacons are hosting a celebration luncheon on September 22nd. We have over thirty folks who have been members of the church for at least 50 years with a few that have been with us for over 70 years. More information will be coming soon, but we look forward to celebrating the commitment and contribution of these long standing members.

In addition to bringing food for MCEF on the 1st, some of you might be interested in participating in Hanover Habitat's Living Generously: Building on Faith 2019 event to be held September 14th. Here is the information for this event from the Habitat website:




Kid's Worship will begin again on **September 8**th. Kid's Worship is for children ages 3 years through 2nd grade and are dismissed from the 9:00am church service after the

Do you know how long you've been a member here at Fairfield? 10 years? 25 years? Maybe 50 years?




Honor your grandparents with a gift that all generations can enjoy.


