

An Evening with Nicole Unice

On Wednesday, September 25th, women of our community gathered in our family center for fellowship, music ministry and a message from featured speaker, Nicole Unice, about how God calls us to be strong and courageous. Angela Blue organized this event following her facilitation of our year long journey through Nicole Unices' books, "She's Got Issues," "The Struggle Is Real," and "Brave Enough." Women whom were both familiar and unfamiliar with the books and women from our community at large gathered together to hear a lively discussion about Joshua 1:9, which reads "Be strong and courageous. Do not be afraid or discouraged. For the Lord your God is with you wherever you go." Nicole illustrated how God's Word knows no timeline and that while it can be challenging, we must be still and wait. What was true for Joshua. is true for all of us. Each of us have struggles and battles to fight, but due to our relationship with God, and his ultimate plan for us, we shall overcome. The struggle is not without purpose. God chose each of us for a purpose, and God will use us for that purpose when we wait and trust his will. As we trust, listen and have patience we will find peace and direction in God, and through his Word. Nicole emphasized that God gives us wisdom without fault and people to live our lives out with. Faith can't be done alone, and should be done in community, just like this great event with Christain women coming together in faith and fellowship.

In addition to an inspiring message from Nicole, all in attendance were treated with a dinner provided by the church and prepared in love by Dwight Clark. The centerpieces, and some of the remaining mums from the 50+ celebration the previous Sunday, were given out as door prizes to attendees. Donna Carson, whirlwind of activity, anticipates needs before they are spoken. Women from Connect, Deacons, and Elders helped make a quick turn around of the tables and chairs following the presentation. Angela truly thought about all of the details down to the bright green t-shirts for those volunteering to assist during the evening.

I am thankful to have individuals in our church that seek out ways to reach spiritual needs of all persons. When you feel energized and ready to dive into a new study at 9 p.m. on a Wednesday after a full day of work, that is a feeling of empowerment and when I know that I have experienced something special. Nicole left attendees with three questions that all should be asking themselves to be intentional in finding and living out their purpose while reflecting on your current faith community and practice in the Word. 1) Are you intentional in your practice, to grow and be transformed in your relationship with God? Setting aside time each day for devotion and seeking out ways to discuss and engage expanding the faith beyond yourself can help to set your intention. 2) Are you the first level of care for someone outside of your immediate family? This fosters community, purpose and connection. 3) Do you pray with or for anyone or talk with anyone about your faith? This can lead to spiritual maturity. Continue to look for the blessings in all things, as goodness and mercy is still and always present in God's love.

Notes from your Session


After taking the summer off from our stated meetings, your Session met on September 17th and they:


- Learned that we have received four bids for the repaying of the parking lots and driveway.
