#### November 2019



Once again our thoughts turn to thanksgiving as fall truly sets in around us. Most of us do not follow the rhythm of the seasons anymore as we have been separated for years from agricultural patterns. When

we gather at table together every month we celebrate what the church from its origins has called a thanksgiving feast.

The Book of Order of the Presbyterian Church USA, the guidebook of our theological traditions and instructions for the life of the church says the following of the Lord's Supper.

The Reformed tradition understands the Lord's Supper to be a sign of God's covenant. The bread of the Lord's Supper is linked with the bread of Passover and the gift of manna in the wilderness. The Lord's Supper thus connects us with God's saving power and providential care from generation to generation. Like the offering of sacrifices, a sign of Israel's thanksgiving for God's faithfulness, the Lord's Supper is a sacrifice of praise and a sign of our gratitude for God's steadfast love. The Lord's Supper represents God's gracious invitation to an everlasting covenant. The Lord's Supper also reflects our calling to feed others as we have been fed, and offers a foretaste of that heavenly banquet when God will wipe away every tear and swallow up death forever.

The Book of Order speaks of Communion as offering "an abundant feast of theological

meaning." The table that makes up a central place in our churches connects us with generations of our ancestors who recognized and passed on deep gratitude as they witnessed the abundant graciousness of God for all of creation. The gracious joy of the sacrifices of ancient Israel was brought home to me as the youth have been studying Leviticus. The first three sacrifices detailed in the book are gifts of thanksgiving. The first thing the people need to know is how to gratefully respond to a God who has freed them from oppression and provided them with manna to eat and divine presence to quide.

There is much to ponder in the theology of our gathering at table, but even more there is much for which we should give thanks. For every time we gather at table in the church or in our homes there is cause to be grateful for the abundance all around us. Every time we wake up in winter, spring, summer or fall there is cause to make a sacrifice of praise. This November, and all the days of our lives, let us wake up grateful that we have been invited to the feast, overwhelmed with joy that we can have this foretaste of the banquet of the realm of God. Let us rejoice and let us share our joy and our food

- Listened to the Commissioners report for the previous Presbytery meeting and reminded the next commissioners of the upcoming meeting.

#### **Stewardship & Finance**

The Stewardship and Finance Committee has much to report this month! First, we have been asked by the Session to work with the Facilities Committee to have the parking lot and driveway repaired and resurfaced. Quotes have been submitted and the Facilities Committee has chosen the company who will be completing the work, hopefully in the next few weeks. We decided not to burden the church with another loan for this expensive repair and instead we will loan ourselves the funds. We will borrow from our reserves and then use contributions to the Capital Fund to replenish the Reserve Account. If you would like to help defray some of the cost of the parking lot repair and repaving, simply make a note on your contribution that says "paving". This will reduce the amount we need to borrow from the Reserve Account, improving its readiness for the next need.

Second, the Session has approved the Asking Budget for 2020. We will be presenting it to the congregation in early November with a bulletin insert summarizing the budget and changes from 2019. Some of the changes include a \$3,000 increase for Building Repairs and a \$2,000 increase for Special Mission Projects. The Asking Budget represents a 2.2% increase over 2019. Pledged and Non-Pledged giving will need about a 4.5% increase to meet it.

Which brings us to our third item, the 2020 Stewardship Campaign, which will be starting soon. The theme for this year's campaign is "**Deep Roots, Sustaining Wings**" and will focus not only on our deep and rich history here at Fairfield, but that of our Christian faith as well. We ask that you begin prayerfully considering your pledge for 2020. If you have not pledged to Fairfield before, we invite you to do so this year. On Sunday, **November 24** we will dedicate our pledges to the church for the coming year. Your pledge is vital to help plan Fairfield's programs for 2020.

Finally, we want to thank everyone who has signed up for E-Giving! E-Giving allows you to have your financial gift to the church sent electronically from your bank account on a regular basis (weekly, monthly, etc.). It also allows you to make one-time donations to the church, such as for a mission project or special program. You have the convenience of making your contribution while you are thinking about it, from your home computer or mobile device, without having to mail or even write a check. #### **Take Your Kids to Church**

Take your kids to church. Make the effort. Wake them up early. Fool with the belts and the buckles and the fancy hair bows. Endure the sleepy, grumpy faces and the misplaced shoes. Run around like a mad woman gathering everybody's everything and trying to get out the door on time. Hop to the car with a shoe in each hand. Give those babies a pop-tart and some milk and let 'em eat it in the car. If its raining, get wet. If its cold, get a jacket. If you're tired, go tired. But take those babies to church. You know why?

Because Jesus is there.

He's there. And He'll meet them there. And you too, Mama. He'll be there in the sweet smile of their Sunday School teacher as she greets them into their room. He'll be there in the goldfish and the apple juice and the filling of their little bellies and hearts. He'll be there in the hug from a sweet friend and the encouraging smile that assures you that they "just barely made it" too. He'll be there in the sacred words read from the Bible speaking truth to their little impressionable hearts. He'll be there in the worship and the raised hands and the watery eyes and whispers of praise.

So take them. Carry all of their Bibles and drawings and toilet paper tube creations. Sit by them in worship. Open your Bible and open theirs. Show them how to find the scripture the pastor is preaching from. Show them how to worship. Explain to them why He's worthy of worship. Let them see you laugh and cry and praise and study. Forgive their wiggles and paper rustles and know that they're listening even when it seems like they aren't. Ask them questions and answer the ones they ask you. Introduce them to Jesus. Tell them of His greatness - his power - his faithfulness. Tell them with your words and show them with your life. Tell them what he's done for you and how you've been changed by His grace and forgiveness and goodness and love. Tell them how they can be too. Point them to Jesus. Over and over and over again.

Take your kids to church. They'll love it there. It's the only place where they can go and just be themselves. They don't have to "be" good enough or smart enough or athletic enough. They don't have to perform for approval or achievement. They just get to go and hear how much God loves them. Just because they're them. Just because He created them, they're valued. Wanted. Their worth isn't based on the grades they make or their ability to throw a curveball. Its not dependent on their performance or skill level. And they need a little more of that, don't you think? A little more grace and a little less pressure. A little more love and a few less demands.

Take them to church. Before you take them to the ballfield or the gym. Before you take them on vacation or to grandma's or to the backyard to play. Take them to church. Let them know it's a priority. Show them it has eternal value. Let them see you set aside schedules and extra curricular activities and work and busyness to be present with the Lord in His house. I promise you won't regret it. I promise you it won't return back void. Take them to church.




What you do:


