#### January 2020

Welcome to 2020! With my vision problems, I cannot help but imagine my ophthalmologist saying these words to me. The year 2020 has got me thinking about vision. The saying hindsight is 20/20 has come to mind on more than one occasion. Unfortunately, this saying is only ideally true. You only have to spend a little time around my family to realize how the way people remember things involves less than perfect vision.

The scripture that came to my mind is a very odd one from the gospel of Matthew that goes like this, "The eye is the lamp of the body. So, if your eye is healthy, your whole body will be full of light; but if your eye is unhealthy, your whole body will be full of darkness." What might this short saying offer us as a way of correcting our vision for 2020?

First, we have to see the metaphor as not connected to our current understanding of the way the eye works. The point behind the metaphor is that we do see the world differently depending on our inner dispositions. "One person's trash is another person's art." Think of the way different people deal with a similar situation of struggle or joy. Here in the Sermon on the Mount, Jesus is suggesting that to live as God's people, it is important to have healthy ways of seeing the world. If our vision of the people and places around us is clouded by unhealthy ways of seeing, then our inner lives will be filled with darkness.

Second, this parable of the eye comes in between talk of treasures and serving God or wealth. The words used to describe the healthy and unhealthy eye suggests that Jesus is helping us to understand how our way of seeing the world is very tied up with the way that we see

people and possessions. The healthy eye sees the world as a gift and is able to be generous with what is inside and out shedding light on those around them. The unhealthy eye is consumed with envy and stinginess so that the light is shrouded within and they cannot share what little light remains.

The prescription that Jesus might offer us is a daily dose of the light of the world. We could begin to transform our ways of seeing in 2020 by taking up a practice of reading a bit of the gospels everyday. How would Jesus have seen this situation? Am I seeing the way Jesus would have me see? Who is offering me a pair of glasses that is only distorting and darkening my godly vision? I recommend that you start with Matthew since that is our Gospel for this year, but you can begin anywhere.

I was reminded by Wallace Bubar of an old optical illusion where you look at this image of Jesus for a certain amount of time and then when you look away you see that image wherever your eyes fall. I think this is another good metaphor and hope for us in 2020. May our daily, weekly, or however frequent focus on Jesus help us to begin to see him everywhere as we begin to see by his light flooding our life.




## Under-Age Thinking...



- Permanent markers
- Foil pan and cooking spray
- Drop cloth
- Gloves
- Quick-set concrete (and adult help)
- Bucket and paint stirrer

#### What you do:

- 1. After reflecting on the past year, use markers to decorate stones with memorable words, dates and drawings.
- 2. Spray pan with cooking spray. Set pan outside on a drop cloth.
- 3. Wearing gloves, mix concrete in a bucket, according to instructions.
- 4. Pour concrete into pan. Smooth top with paint stirrer.
- 5. Press in stones, handprints and other decorations.
- 6. Let dry completely. Remove from pan.
- 7. Place the stepping-stone outside as a reminder of God's continued goodness.


