Epiphany is a season celebrated in the Christian Church from as far back as the 300s. Historically, it has been a time to


celebrate everything from the continued celebration of Christ's birth, the coming of the magi, and the miracle at the wedding of Cana. The specific focus in some traditions is on the baptism of Jesus Christ, because it is the first manifestation of all three persons of the trinity at one time. As we put 2020 behind us, this new year might be a good one to consider some epiphany themes related to Jesus' baptism.

Epiphany means "manifestation" or "appearance" and in the gospel of Mark we read of the appearance of the spirit in the form of a dove when Jesus comes up out of the water. Mark says that the heavens were ripped open, using a word that suggests that the border between God and humanity has been torn apart and will not be sealed off again. Mark will use this word again at the end of the gospel to say that the veil in the temple was ripped apart opening access to the holy of holies to all. This new year let us remember that, no matter how far off God may seem at times, in Jesus Christ the wall between God and us has been torn down and the spirit has descended into each of our hearts and lives.

In the gospel of Mark, God says from the heavens at Jesus' baptism: "You are my Son, the Beloved; with you I am well pleased." These words combine two themes from the Old Testament. One of God's kingdom and its representative as found in Psalm 2 and the Suffering Servant of Isaiah. These simple words

spoken to Jesus remind him of his mission. He will be crowned king and lord, but the coronation will look quite different than most will expect. In Christ we are part of the new humanity following the one true king, but his kingdom is one of service and self-giving love (Mark 10:42-45).

What should also be manifest to each of us this season is that we are people who share in the baptism of Jesus Christ. As Tom Wright says in Mark for Everyone, "The whole Christian gospel could be summed up in this point: that when the living God looks at us, at every baptized and believing Christian, he says to us what he said to Jesus on that day. God sees us, not as we are in ourselves, but as we are in Jesus Christ." Remember this Epiphany that you are a beloved child of God in whom the Creator of all takes delight.

During an expedited meeting on December 15th your Elders....

- learned of a new mission taking place in the city of Richmond feeding the homeless: Lashanna Foundation
- endorsed the annual offering of the Blue Christmas service on December 21st to remember those who have been promoted to glory and support those who are grieving
- wished well and expressed their appreciation for the work of Allen Boyle, Larry Hansbrough, Jenny Young and K.C. Whitaker who are each rotating off the Session
- heard that facilities management is keeping busy with the repair of the tractor, carpets being cleaned and the addition of solar film on the windows of the Barlow Parlor
- approved this budget for 2021, slightly lower than the asking budget but in line with our caution as we move through the final months of Covid-19
- celebrated the fact that the congregation has generously provided and that cost cutting measures
 have enabled us to end the year in the positive and has enabled us to do a tremendous amount of
 mission to help people make it through these trying times
- gratefully heard of the continuing success of the Wednesday evening zoom prayer and study events
- delighted to know that the Children's Sunday School program is doing well and is being offered in a very safe manner
- celebrated the fact that Fairfield Church rose to the occasion of helping children and families in our neighborhood through our cooperation and support of the Cold Harbor Elementary School over \$1,600 was raised for gifts and essentians for these families
- supported the Deacons as they reported to us that they are trying to further discern and refine the way that they serve the homebound of our congregation
- heard the report of the Christmas Eve Worship Service Task Force that we hold three services, each in the Family Center and that all precautions be taken to do so as safely as possible.
- adjourned for the year and will meet again with the new class of Elders on January 19th 2021

- Crayons
- Metal baking sheet
- Adult help
- Metal gingerbread man cookie cutter

What you do:

- Remove labels and break crayons into 1-inch pieces.
- 2. Scatter pieces on the baking sheet, about two layers thick.
- 3. Bake for 10 minutes at 350 degrees until melted. Allow to cool 15 minutes.
- 4. When melted crayons are the consistency of playdough, press the cookie cutter through them (while still on pan).
- 5. Cool the pan in freezer for 15 minutes until crayons are hardened.
- 6. Remove from pan and break apart the shapes.
