like a lifetime since we have had a "normal"



We will be live streaming the later two since we know we can't be at full capacity nor is everyone comfortable inside quite yet.

I actually think that there is some wisdom in going through these trying times. Think about it. How were things unfolding on the first Easter? The followers of Jesus Christ were in mayhem and confusion. They didn't know what was happening. They were lost in the confusion of mixed messages. They had no idea what that day would bring and certainly they had no idea of how that day would impact the rest of their lives. It was certainly not the best of times and it very well may have been the worst of times for the fledgling Christian community.

Yet, in the midst of that havoc came the voices that began to explain that hope was not gone: Jesus was not dead but very much alive. In the midst of the confusion and mixed messages that we hear every day from the world around us, God is still working good out for us. If death has been conquered how much more so will this dreaded disease be conquered? And maybe more to the point: if the hopelessness of the early followers of Jesus Christ can be reversed 180 degrees how much more so can the Easter message give us a renewed sense of hope as we look forward to our days ahead?

Sometimes we get caught up in thinking we need to understand God in order to have faith. But faith is more about trust than knowledge; it's more about believing in someone that believing information. A child, for instance, doesn't have to know the precise roads to Grandma's house; he only needs to believe in his parents and their ability and desire to get him there safely. Similarly, we need not understand all the intricacies of how God works; we can take a cue from the disciples and let belief in the risen Christ transform and empower us.

In the words of Madeleine L'Engle (*The Rock That is Higher*): "The disciples did not bother to try to understand the resurrection body. They doubted, and then they believed. They believed something so wonderful that it changed this broken, fragmented, beaten-down little group of men and women in a moment from depression to enthusiasm, from despair ro new life, vibrant and unafraid."



Your Elders meet for their stated March meeting on March 16th in the Heritage Hall. During their meeting they:

- approved the minutes of the February meeting
- received the report of the good work the Deacons are doing including cards and devotionals
  which were mailed to shut ins and plans for Brunswick stew to be delivered to homebound
  members as well
- · heard that Team Youth gathered, prepared and mailed care packages for our college students
- decided to follow our tradition of not serving communion on Easter Sunday even though it falls on the first Sunday of the month
- forwarded to the Facilities Management Team a request for building use one day a week by a home school organization
- affirmed our desire to hold an Easter Sunrise service on our own this year due to the status of our sister churches. It will be held on our side lawn by the crosses at 7:00 a.m.
- gratefully learned that the Facilities Management Team is working diligently and well to maintain our facilities through a project management schedule. They also will be doing immediate work such as fixing toilets and lighting issues
- rejoiced in learning that our Endowment Fund continues to grow and is making a big difference in both Missions and Building needs above what our budget can do
- celebrated the receipt of the bequest of \$57,000.00 from the Estate of Janie Harrington which will be added to her named Endowment Fund
- grateful to hear that the Wednesday evening prayer meeting and Lenten study continues to do well under team leadership
- were glad to hear that Alec and Angela continue to do good work with the children of the church and had plans for the arrival of the Easter Bunny
- heard that the schedule for Holy Week will include a Good Friday service in the sanctuary but we
  will not have a Maundy Thursday service this year
- discussed the progress of the Task Force on solar panels and the Task Force on memorial garden/columbarium as they each are in the information gathering stage of their work
- received the report of the commissioners to the Presbytery meeting as they explained the plans for reorganizing the Presbytery of the James and learned of the closing of two more congregations: Lakeside and New Covenant
- continues to discuss how we will work our way back to a full reopening of the church post covid-
- adjourned to meet again on April 20th in Heritage Hall



## Under-Age Thinking...



Answer: "Why do you look for the living among the dead? He is not here; he has risen!" Luke 24:5-6, MIV



The hidden surprise in these sweet rolls hints at the reason behind Easter's joy.

#### What you need:

- ½ cup chopped pecans
- 10 uncooked frozen rolls, thawed
- 10 large marshmallows
- ½ cup sugar
- 1 tsp cinnamon
- 1/2 cup melted butter
- ¼ cup brown sugar
- Adult help

#### What you do:

- 1. Grease a round baking dish. Sprinkle pecans on the bottom.
- 2. Flatten each roll. Place a marshmallow in the center, wrap dough around it and pinch edges together.
- 3. Combine sugar and cinnamon. Dip each roll into melted butter and coat with cinnamon-sugar. Place in pan, seam side down.
- 4. Sprinkle brown sugar and remaining butter over rolls. Cover with plastic wrap and let rise 30 minutes.
- Bake at 350 degrees until golden brown, about 30 minutes. Cool in pan.
- 6. As you bite into a roll, you'll see the marshmallow has melted, leaving an empty center just like Jesus' empty tomb!
