Your Elders met on May 18th for their stated meeting during which time they:

- Received correspondence which was delegated to the Personnel/Nominations Team
- · Approved the minutes of both the previous meeting and the congregational meeting
- Heard the good work the Deacons are doing including providing several weeks of meals to a family,
 the gratitude of the recipients of the Brunswick stew and plans for a possible community garden
- Prayerfully and carefully considered the most recent CDC guidelines and voted to release the previous rule that all people will wear face masks in church to allow those who are fully vaccinated to attend maskless
- · Discussed the titles given to ministers who "belong" to a local church
- Learned that the negotiations with Classical Conversations was progressing well
- Supported the Facilities Management Team in their plan to replace one of the HVAC units for the Family Center
- Affirmed the decision of the Team to replace the gutters on the church with seamless gutters because
 of the myriad leaks in the original gutters
- Encouraged the Team to further investigate a video security system for the church
- Noted repairs were being made to the tractor
- · Rejoiced that the Personnel/Nominations Team was working hard with all of their responsibilities
- Celebrated our commitment to the plan of worship plus two for all members as we look toward restarting our full range of Sunday School classes this fall
- Pleased to know that an excellent group of 19 young people and adults will be heading to Altoona PA for mission work late in June
- Talked at length and affirmed our desire to rekindle the Kids Clothing Exchange and how we can help families to break the cycle of generational poverty through mentorship and education
- Learned that as we slowly return to normal, we will need more greeters/ushers and others to make our Sunday morning work smoothly
- · Were updated on the progress of the Memorial Garden/Columbarium Task Force
- Heard that the Solar Panel Task Force is gathering information
- Elected two financially literate persons to be our commissioners to the June Presbytery of the James virtual meeting
- Adjourned with prayer until their next stated meeting June 15

Answer: breach, egg, ram, hole, hurricane, sun



Make a sunflower, which turns its head to follow the sun.

What you need:

- Paper plate
- Yellow marker
- Scissors
- Yarn (black and brown)

What you do:

- Color the entire plate yellow.
- 2. Around the edge, cut out an odd number of triangles. Evenly space the cuts to form flower petals.
- 3. Poke a hole in the plate's center. String black yarn through the hole and over one triangle cut. Tie a knot at the back of the plate.
- 4. Continue looping yarn through the hole and over the remaining cuts. Secure the end. The flower should look like a wagon wheel with black spokes.
- 5. Tie the brown yarn to a black "spoke." Weave the brown yarn over and under the spokes in a circle.
 Continue until the sunflower has a large center.
 Then tie the end.
- 6. Display your craft as a reminder to follow the Son, Jesus!


