Last year's trip was disrupted by my illness but more so by the concerns over the Covid-19 pandemic and its impact upon Fairfield Church. As I look forward to this year's trip, I carry with me some wonderful memories of the pandemic. I know! I know! That just does not sound right! Nobody has good memories of the pandemic! But wait a minute and let me explain!

Fairfield Presbyterian Church rose to the occasion and embodied the work of Jesus Christ during the crisis. Certainly, the rapidity with which we were able to offer online worship is commendable. But we also offered several different ways to include folks in the worship of God through both electronic and printed means. Untold hours were spent by people who went out of their way to make sure those who were homebound during this time, were checked on and reminded that they were not truly alone.

The one that amazes me though is this: your leadership team at the beginning of the pandemic was making plans to greatly reduce our budget, including laying off staff. However, that moment never came. We, of course, did reduce spending on non-essential items but at the same time, because of your generosity, we shifted a great deal of our resources to helping those for whom the pandemic was causing distress financially. Tens of thousands of dollars were shared with members of the church facing setbacks, as well as with carefully vetted folks within our community were helped as well. We were able to help with everything from food to mortgage payments to car repairs. Through the generosity of one of our members we now have a revolving loan fund to help people going through difficult times. Fairfield Presbyterian Church makes a difference in people's lives!

For these reasons and many more, I am heading to the lake with a happy heart knowing that I serve a congregation that has taken its call as followers of Jesus Christ seriously. I am proud to be your Pastor.

Endowments & Bequests

I was recently asked a question about endowments and bequests to the church. I thought maybe there might be others who would have the same questions in the back of our minds. So, let me share my answer with everyone. If you have further questions, please feel free to call upon Gene Rosen or J. R. Marker or myself.

Fairfield Presbyterian Church maintains an Endowment Fund to help the Church to be able to do all of the work we are called to do. This Endowment Fund is make up of a number of individual accounts which are named in honor of the donors or whomever they designated. I mentioned that one we have is the John A. Starzer Fund which I established for my late brother. The income from that particular fund is used for the building needs. All of our endowment fund monies are invested in New Covenant Funds which is owned by the Presbyterian denomination. They are invested to protect against inflation while at the same time producing a string of income that continually helps the Church. These investment accounts are overseen by our Stewardship and Finance Team which boasts some excellent skills in this area.

If you wanted to establish a fund, you could name it whatever you wished, such as for a family member you would like to have remembered, including yourself. Or you could establish more than one fund each with a different purpose. Each fund goes toward one of four areas: Building, Mission, Music, or Christian Education.

There is always the concern that money will be taxed if not handled properly. We all want to avoid that! There are two things to consider there, as I understand it, one is in a will, a good lawyer would help you to word it properly to assure that the Church receives the money and that the Church will use it in the manner you desire. Usually the wording is something like "... to the Fairfield Presbyterian Church or its successor ... to be used to establish theFund for...."

The other issue to consider to avoid the government taxing money is in mandatory distributions. I am told that this is easily avoided (and may help you establish the named endowment funds early) is to direct the company which manages the fund to make the payments directly to the Church. This will avoid any tax liability since this would be considered a tax qualified charitable distribution. A few folks in the Church do this and have found it advantageous in their tax liabilities.

I hope this is helpful to many of you. This kind of planning assures that Fairfield Presbyterian will remain strong even in challenging times. Again, if you have questions, please simply ask us.




