table. Boundaries between job and personal life blurred, as did any sense of being "off duty."

Most of us prefer clear divisions between our tasks and time. While such separations may help with scheduling, they are artificial human constructs. "Whatever your task," says Colossians 3:23 (NRSV, emphasis added) - whether in public or private, family or job, spiritual or worldly activities - "put yourselves into it as done for the Lord." Verse 17 tells us to "do everything" in Jesus' name, "giving thanks to God the Father through him."

That means even work and worship interlock. As Rick Warren writes, "Work becomes worship when you dedicate it to God and perform it with an awareness of his presence."


All donations are accepted the first and third Sunday of each month from 2 - 3:30pm.

# Prayer bracelet

Make this craft to help you remember the Lord's Prayer.




#### What you need:

- Elastic string (12 inches)
- Colored beads (see below)
- Clear nail polish

#### What you do:

- 1. Knot the string at one end. Add beads in this order: blue, white, gold, green, yellow, red, black, orange
- 2. Tie the ends so the bracelet fits your wrist. Place a dot of nail polish to secure the knot. Trim excess string.
- 3. As you pray, use the bead colors as reminders of Jesus' words (see Matthew 6:9-13):
  - blue = the Father
  - white = God's holiness
  - **gold** = God's kingdom
  - green = the earth
  - **yellow** = wheat (bread)
  - red = Christ's blood (forgiveness)
  - black = temptation
  - orange = God's power to deliver

### Serving the Lord by Serving His People - Youth Mission Trip 2021

At the end of June, Fairfield sent nineteen youth and adults on a service mission to Altoona, Pennsylvania. This year was a year like no other mission trip. The biggest change - we were missing our fearless leader, Mitzi Marker, and we did not have a youth pastor on the trip. Not to mention we were dealing with the ongoing pandemic. With the absence of two key players, several adults stepped up to serve as chaperones: Mandy Harding, Chuck Patterson, Sam Patterson (our junior chaperone), Alec Powell (Fairfield's intern), Nicole Hillard (Mitzi's recruit), and me (Amy Atkinson). As always, our youth team was amazing and consisted of the following:

Due to COVID, 95% of our service projects this year were outdoors with only one assignment indoors (cleaning windows). We had four different homes that we assisted in a trailer park, one rural home, one home in town, and we worked one day at a thrift store. Mostly, we served widowed women who needed assistance with outdoor projects including painting, yardwork, and landscaping. You would be so proud of our young people! And even though Mitzi was not physically with us, she truly was with us. Anytime we needed anything (and I mean anything), we found it in Mitzi's magical tote!

During the day, we worked hard, but in the evening we attended chapel and worshiped our Lord. Teameffort provided praise music and the message each night. The Fairfield team would then return to camp and hold our devotion. I could see each one of the young people growing closer to Christ.

This trip could not have been possible without the support of the congregation and deacons, individual sponsorship, and prayers. We are so grateful tht your generosity made this possible.
