Dear friends,

October is a month of changes. We watch as the leaves change colors. We notice the days growing shorter. We feel the temperatures chilling our bones. So, we, as a denomination, came up with a way to acknowledge their relationship to a church where they are not a Pastor. That's where we came up with the Parish Associate title.

All of this is to help to introduce you to a wonderful man who has served Presbyterian Churches in Pennsylvania, Florida and Virginia over his 40 plus years of ordained ministry. The Rev. Dr. Keith Curran has been worshiping,

along with his wife, Debbie, since Easter and we have invited him to be part of our life together as a Parish Associate. His title (since I don't like the official term) will be Minister in Residence to signify his years of faithful service and to express the joy that he is now dwelling with us as one of our family.

This is an honorary title with no responsibilities and no compensation. Whatever kind of ministry Keith finds to do among us will be of his choosing. We are just glad that he is here and he and Debbie are a part of our church family.

By the way, did I mention that Keith and I were classmates in Seminary and are thoroughly enjoying getting reacquainted? God is good to bring an old friend back into my life. I know, too, you will agree that God is good for bringing a wonderful new friend into your life.

Gathering on September 21st in the Open-Door Classroom your Elders:

He also told us that an elder from the Commission on Ministry will be assigned to help us through the process.
- Welcomed the Rev. Dr. Keith Curran to the meeting where we were able to learn a little bit about his faith and his long ministry as a Presbyterian pastor. - Approved the minutes for two previous meetings without exception
- Affirmed our desire to welcome back Compass Sports for the basketball season starting January 2022.
- Joyfully received Caroline Carneal as both our student intern from Union Presbyterian Seminary and as a member of our congregation.
- Learned of the many projects which Facilities Management is undertaking.
- Were informed that a second compressor will need to be replaced for the family center as all of the HVAC. systems in the "new wing" near and past the 20-year mark.
- Heard from the Nominating Committee that their work is progressing well, and they are excited about the people who have hard the call to serve.
- Stewardship team let us know that our finances are in a good place as generosity and frugality seem to be serving us well to stabilize the church during this time of uncertainty.
- Celebrated the faithfulness of so many who prayed for the life of Fairfield Church on September 1st.
- Rejoiced that Fall-O-Ween returns this year with an all-outdoor program.

- Were excited to learn that the Children's Clothing Swap will be help this October and that they are looking for volunteers to make this mission happen.
- Learned that ushers and communion volunteers are still needed for the months ahead.
- Got a quick first look at a possibility for the memorial garden/columbarium and will have more time next month to look more thoroughly at it
- After a lengthy meeting of two hours, adjourned to meet again on October 19.

sustains, and blesses us!




