

We Remember

More than 150 years ago, Memorial Day took shape amid the backdrop of the U.S. Civil War. Before it ended, women began decorating the graves of fallen soldiers. In 1868, when May 30 was designated as Decorations Day, loved ones placed flowers on the graves of Union and Confederate soldiers alike.

By 1882, Decorations Day became known as Memorial Day, and soldiers who died in other wars were honored too. Over time, it because a day to remember all loved ones who have died - in war and otherwise. In 1971, Congress

declared Memorial Day a national holiday to be observed on the last Monday in May. Memorial Day pause to remember people who made the ultimate sacrifice for their country and for our freedom. We also pray for those who continue serving, especially those in harm's way.


Session News

Under-Age Thinking...




- · Clean cardboard egg carton

MISSION FUNDS DISBURSEMENTS FOR 2021

With the generous contributions we received last year from the members of Fairfield Presbyterian Church, we were able to raise a total of \$9,827. It enabled us to support so many organizations, internationally, within the U.S., and locally, which spread the word of Christ in their daily efforts, providing needed dollars for their ongoing projects. Each year we ask the same question when considering an organization or cause to support: *How do they spread the love of Jesus Christ in their endeavors?*

We are pleased to share with you how this money was spent and a little about the groups that were supported.

Internationally

David and Susan Howard – The Howard's arrived in Papua, New Guinea in 1998 and have been working among the Adzera people since 1999. David serves as a translation consultant for the Wycliffe Bible Translators and mentor to Adzera speakers translating the Scriptures into their mother tongue and as the team leader for the new Markham Multi-Language Project. He is also a translation consultant, has been involved in training Papua New Guinea Bible translators, and has served in administrative roles to meet short-term needs. Susan works on Adzera literacy projects when home responsibilities allow. She also teaches a literacy class in Ukarumpa and volunteers to meet various other needs in the community. Their goal is to serve with the global body of Christ to advance Bible translation and work together so people can encounter God through his Word. There are 2,000+ languages still awaiting Bible translation.

The Jesus Film Project – Beginning with a two-hour docudrama about the life of Christ, according to the Gospel of Luke, this film project has been seen in every country of the world and translated into over 1900+ languages. It has evolved into an App that is a full digital library of more than 200 full-length movies, miniseries, and short films produced to help the world know Jesus better. Everything on the app is free to watch, download, and share with anyone you meet, wherever you meet them. Since the "JESUS" film was first shown in 1979, more than 490 million people have come to know Christ through the ministry of The JESUS Film Project®. This equates to one person every 5.5 seconds. Campus Crusade for Christ oversees this film project.

The Helping Hands Project - Our used Sunday School Books, Devotional Guides and Paperback Bibles were mailed out to missionaries in many parts of the world. Materials are also used to teach English and they are used in Prison Ministries.

Frontier Fellowship – We help to support Richard Haney, the Executive Director of Frontier Fellowship. PFF describes itself as "a mission support group that works with congregations to establish indigenous churches among unreached people." PFF reaches out to believing communities to engage people groups where the good news of Jesus and his kingdom is not yet known. Of the nearly 7.9 billion people alive today, more than two billion have never heard of Jesus. They seek the world's least-reached places, supporting efforts to establish local churches that can proclaim the Good News of God's Kingdom to their communities and beyond.

Locally

Covenant Woods – we provided assistance for the ongoing cost for senior adults who are no longer able to afford their own care.

MCEF - One Stop Shop (OSS)

Along with other Mechanicsville churches, Fairfield is supporting the operating expenses of the OSS. Now that the ministries of MCEF are under one roof (7235 Stonewall Parkway, 23111), area churches have committed to helping with the operating expenses. Mechanicsville Churches Emergency Functions (MCEF) provides food, clothing, financial assistance and transportation through Senior Rides to our neighbors in the 23111 and 23116 zip codes.

Camp Hanover – Camp Hanover, located in Old Church, Virginia, is a 600- acre Retreat Center where groups are invited to connect, refresh, renew, and grow all year long. An outdoor ministry partner with the Presbytery of the James and Presbyterian Church (USA) serving as a resource congregations utilize to enhance and strengthen their local ministry efforts, to nurture and deepen the spiritual lives of their congregations, and to provide members with opportunities to practice their faith through mission service and outreach. We supported both camperships and maintenance for our local outdoor youth and adult camp, which is a Christ centered community, where youth and adults find their direction and acceptance through God's presence.


Angel Tree Project – Fairfield partnered with Cold Harbor Elementary School to help local families in need during the holidays. Mayfield Kentucky Presbyterian Church


To help support victims of severe tornado damage, funds were sent to the local Presbyterian church to meet immediate needs of the local residents.

Offering the Lord's Supper to the III and the Homebound "Extending the Lord's Table"


In the Directory for Worship of the PC(USA) we are told: "When we gather at the Lord's Supper the Spirit draws us into Christ's presence and unites us with the Church in every time and place. We join with all the faithful in heaven and on earth in offering thanksgiving to the triune God...The opportunity to eat and drink with Christ is not a right bestowed upon the worthy, but a privilege given to the undeserving who come in faith, repentance, and love. All who come to the table are offered the bread and cup, regardless of their age or understanding."

It also states: "As soon as possible after the service (ordinarily on the same day), the bread and cup may be shared with absent, homebound, or hospitalized members by two or more persons in ordered ministry. Those who carry out this extended service of communion shall be authorized by the session; equipped with the necessary theological, pastoral, and liturgical gifts and resources; and instructed to maintain the unity of Word and Sacrament through the reading of Scripture and offering of prayers."

In love and compassion, the Deacons are working on making sure that all members of the body of Christ at Fairfield receive the opportunity to participate in these privileges. We will be offering communion to our hospitalized and homebound members a few times each year. If you know of someone who would be like to be included in the schedule to participate in the Lord's Supper, please give their name(s) to Pastor Sandi or any of the Deacons.
