Dear friends,

- Summer clothes are in full swing. Needs continue to be: new underwear for women and men and bigger boys. A "back to school" shopping day will again be planned for August. Clothes for school age kids and school supplies will be on the list of needs.

Celebrating the church's birthday

On Pentecost, we remember when the Holy Spirit descended on Jesus' disciples. As they gathered in Jerusalem 10 days after Jesus' ascension, they saw tongues of fire, heard rushing wind and began speaking in many languages. Because the disciples could then share the good news with all the pilgrims assembled for the Pentecost festival, the occasion marks the birthday of the Christian church. That day alone, about 3,000 people devoted their lives to Christ.

Like the Holy Spirit, Pentecost is important and relevant today. As theologian Henri Nouwen writes, "Without Pentecost the Christevent - the life, death and resurrection of Jesus - remains imprisoned in history as something to remember, think about and reflect on. The Spirit of Jesus comes to dwell within us, so that we can become living Christs here and now."



Session News - May 17, 2022

Steve began the meeting with a reading from "Mornings with Bonhoeffer" concerning God's Peace. God's Peace isn't supposed to relieve us of our burdens but is there to support us as we deal with life's burdens. Through all our difficulties and worries, there is a divine rainbow of peace that gives us hope.

A Quorum was declared and J. R. Marker was elected Clerk pro-tem

Clerk's Report - Copies of minutes of previous meeting were reviewed. Motion made to accept the minutes.

Pastor's Report

- · Shannon is doing very well, as is her new daughter.
- The Deacons have been meeting regularly and faithfully. They are planning a Fellowship time after the 11:00 service on Sunday, June 12, 2022. There will be pizza and desserts provided and a joyful game of BINGO with prizes.
- There are Blessing Socks located in the Narthex for members to distribute to homeless individuals.
- Steve asked that sometime in the next 6 months, the Session take a look at the church's committee and team structure. We should see if any changes need to be made and possibly add a Communications Team for supporting the church's Information Technology initiatives.
- Steve asked for prayers for Trinity and Village Presbyterian churches as these congregations are currently struggling.

Facilities Management

- Jim France reported that a new roof was recently installed on the Pavilion.
- The church building was recently power washed and looks great.
- They will soon be doing some exterior painting on the church building.
- · They are also planning to do some minor outdoor electrical repairs and driveway repairs.
- The outdoor cameras are still progressing. They are recording but there are some issues when trying to view them live.
- There was a donation to purchase a second Video cart and equipment so that the A/V equipment would not need to be transported back and forth between the Family Center and the Sanctuary. Most of the necessary equipment has already been purchased.
- Billy Putze notified the Session of the hard work John Longest puts in as our Sexton.
- They are working with the Deacons on the possibility of acquiring a second AED unit to have available in the church building.

Nominations/Personnel

- Deborah Wood reported that they are working on a formal Family Leave Policy.
- They are asking each committee to submit a bullet-point list of the responsibilities that the committee has. This will be used to help explain what responsibilities Elders and Deacons have when recruiting nominees.
- Will start looking for new Elders and Deacons in the next month or so.

Stewardship & Finance

- J. R. Marker submitted the Treasurer's Report and reported that while income is up a small amount over last year, expenses are up considerably. Most of the increase if from repairs to the HVAC system and should not be ongoing monthly expenses. The Mission Team also disbursed a large amount of funds to the ministries they support earlier in the year than usual.
- Motion to accept Treasurer's Report passed
- The committee was asked to look at funding the Conceptual Design for a Columbarium from Columbarium Planners, Inc. The cost would be \$8,500. Session voted affirmatively to proceed with the Conceptual Design once concerns were addressed and total cost not to exceed \$8,500.

Team Youth


- J. R. Marker reported that Youth Sunday will be this coming Sunday, 5/22/22.




