Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,



In Seminary, I found that the most challenging classes were often the most interesting and enjoyable. One of those was Hebrew. The Hebrew language, for me, was difficult to learn. The translation of the symbols is much more subjective than some other languages.

However, the time that I spent studying, memorizing, and striving to interpret the language is some of the most rewarding that I have ever spent.

One of the words that I learned and that has stuck with me is the word **ruah**. It is the Hebrew word meaning breath, air, or wind, and it is used to indicate the Spirit of God, or the Holy Spirit. The Holy Spirit is represented by many images in the Bible such as: the tongues of fire, the pillar of cloud, the living water, anointing with oil, the finger of God, and the dove.

Why is "ruah" so meaningful to me? Well, I have been struggling with asthma since I was a very young child. It's a lifetime struggle. So I have spent much of my life struggling to breathe and striving to strengthen my resistance to the things that affect the quality of my breathing. As a young child I remember numerous hospital stays, regimes of allergy shots and medications, days of being stuck inside while my friends played outside, different regimens of exercises that were supposed to help strengthen my lungs. My family even encouraged me to learn to play the oboe, thinking that playing a wind instrument might be helpful.

Whenever I go through an extended struggle, as I have these past few weeks, I am reminded of God's

Ruah. I am reminded that but for the very breath of God, I would not be alive. Often, when I am struggling to inhale I am reminded just how reliant I am on God for each and every moment of my life. Every day, every moment, every breath is God's gift of life to us. The very same God who but spoke and created the world and everything that lives, moves, and breathes upon it is the same God who breathed life into a valley of dry bones and commanded them to live.

I've heard it said, and have found it to be true, that in times of stress, a way to calm one's nerves is to meditate on a word or a phrase during each inhalation and exhalation. An example would be to think "Come ..." during each inhale of breath, and to think, "Lord Jesus" during each exhale. This helps to center our minds on the very presence of God. I've found it to be calming and that it keeps me mindful of God's very presence with me in any given moment.

Dear friends, I am grateful to God, the giver of life. I am grateful that God continues to sustain my life and that God sees fit to use me according to God's own purposes. May we each remember and be grateful for each day, each moment, and each breath as it comes.

"Then he said to me, "Prophesy to the breath, prophesy, mortal, and say to the breath: [c] Thus says the Lord God: Come from the four winds, O breath, [d] and breathe upon these slain, that they may live." I prophesied as he commanded me, and the breath came into them, and they lived and stood on their feet, a vast multitude."
(Ezekiel 37: 9-10)


Thank you for the blood drive on June 21. We collected 20 units which can help as many as 60 lives! We must have had a few walk-ins

Here are a few highlights from the MCEF One Stop Shop:

- Again this summer, MCEF will have a Back to School Shopping Day for current clients. Kids (preschool through high school) will have the opportunity to choose some outfits for school and get some new socks and underwear. School supply lists will be on hand to help students pick some school supplies. Donations for this event will be collected right up until the day before.
- Back to School Shopping Days are Tuesday evening, August 16 from 6-7:30 p.m. and Wednesday morning, August 17 from 9:30-11:00 a.m.
- As of July 1, 2022, the reimbursement for Sr. Rides drivers will increase to 50¢ a mile.
- Pantry needs include anything you can donate. MCEF is currently purchasing some items to fill out the shelves with protein rich foods and some paper products. Ideas - cereal, soups, personal care products and school supplies.
- The Tools for Teachers (T4T) and ARC Thrift Store will have a ribbon cutting on June 25th at 11:00. They are housed in the old Green Top store on Route 1.

For the month of May the OSS served 115 families (345 persons in household), welcomed 14 new families, distributed 170 bags of food and 9 second helpings of food and gave out 78 bags of clothing and 10 bags of linens. You helped this happen! Thank you.

That uninterested, distracted or unresponsive person may be nearer the Kingdom that we - or they - realize." Kalas adds, "We dare not give up on anyone at any time - including ourselves."

Make a scene with this fun summer craft you can create outdoors.




What you need:

- Play sand
- Spoons
- Empty jars
- Powdered tempera paint
- Cardstock paper and pencil
- Craft glue
- · Paintbrush -




What you do:

- 1. Pour a few tablespoons of sand into empty jars. (You need one jar for every color of paint you make.)
- 2. Add a small amount of powdered paint to the sand and then mix. Experiment with the amount, using more paint to create deeper colors.
- 3. Lightly sketch a design on cardstock.
- 4. Working in one small section at a time, paint an even layer of craft glue on the paper.
- 5. Use a spoon to sprinkle colored sand atop the glue. Tilt the paper so extra sand falls off. Repeat to complete the entire design.
- 6. Let dry on a flat surface before displaying upright.
