Dear Brother and Sisters in Christ,

November is a wonderful time of the year. The holiday.

Thanksgiving, is coming up! For those who enjoy Facebook, November becomes a time for Gratitude Challenges, when people are encouraged/prompted to list things they are grateful for each day of the month. Most posts are what you would expect, pictures and loving words about family members, friends, pets, good health, and the material things that make life comfortable. And I believe this is an important spiritual discipline for us to develop - to become in the habit of "counting our blessings," as the hold hymn exhorts us to do.

And that's a great start; however, I believe that to have an attitude of gratitude involves more than just feeling grateful and being able to count/list our blessings. That's actually just the beginning. To truly live life with an attitude of gratitude, we should do more. Being grateful should inform how we live and how we treat others in every aspect of our lives. In my mind, it goes hand-in-hand with living out our Christian calling to "love God and enjoy God forever." For example, consider the well-loved story/song about Zaccheus, the "we little man" who climbed a sycamore tree in order to get a view of Jesus as he moved through the crowd. (I'll pause here while you finish singing the song) @ At first glance, this story is about how every one of us is loved and accepted by God, equally. And we're comforted by the thought that God knows our name. God seeks us out and finds us, even in the middle of a crowd, even if we're sitting up on the branch of a tree, hiding among the foliage.

And yet, if we take the time to read the story in scripture (Luke 19:1-10), we discover that it's really a story of repentance, transformation, and redemption. "How so?" you ask? Well, consider that Jesus bestowed a great honor on this little man who was

described as rich, chief tax collector. And also consider that Zaccheus was not well-liked in him community because tax collectors were well-known for tacking on additional fees when they collected the taxes for the Romans, in order to make a profit to line their own pockets. Now, it might not be a crime to want to provide an income for one's efforts, but tax collectors were known for charging more than what was fair. Hence, they were resented and seen as greedy and uncaring.

But when Jesus invited himself to Zaccheus' home, Zaccheus was so grateful to be honored by Jesus that he became repentant. His eyes were opened by the appearance of God right in front of him and he realized that he had been taking advantage of others. He had a complete turn-around in his thinking and he said to Jesus, "Look, half of my possessions, Lord, I will give to the poor; and if I have defrauded anyone of anything, I will pay back four times as much."

Wow! This is a huge sacrifice for Zaccheus to make! Most would be impressed with a small additional bit of interest tacked on the what had been taken. But, friends, this is more than just a momentary feeling of gratitude. This is a lifechanging event in Zaccheus' life! And for Zaccheus, he commits to living out the rest of his life in a manner that Jesus - and God - will be glorified. Hallelujah! May we take note of this lesson and do likewise...

"Then Jesus said to him, 'Today salvation has come to this house, because he too (Zaccheus) is a son of Abraham. For the Son of man came to seek out and to save the lost." (Luke 19:9-10)





What you do:


- 1. Cut the paper into strips about 2 inches wide.
