

Mechanicsville Churches Emergency Functions (MCEF) and One Stop Shop (OSS)

Greetings from MCEF and the One Stop Shop. Spring must be just around the corner. Things are blooming! A couple of things to report this month:

- It seems that Kroger (our outlet for the bags we use in the pantry for clients) is using a shorter bag. If you still get some of the taller bags with handles, please consider donating them to MCEF. Our supply is beginning to dwindle.
- The new procedure for receiving requests for financial assistance through the website is working well. In January we received 26 requests and were able to help 15.
- Pantry needs: green peas, mixed greens, boxed potatoes, mayo, catsup, broth, port and beans, jelly (not grape), pineapple, applesauce. As always, whatever you donate is greatly appreciated.
- Clothing needs: hooded sweatshirts (without company logos) for men and boys; men's Tshirts (all sizes and colors, but especially larger sizes) long and short sleeve; women's tops (all sizes, but especially larger sizes.)
- No more winter coats for now. We have a good supply.
- As many of you already know, Smile.Amazon.com is no longer working with local non-profits. We have appreciated the income this has generated for MCEF.

MISSION FUNDS DISBURSEMENTS FOR 2022

With the generous contributions we received last year from the members of Fairfield Presbyterian Church, we were able to raise a total of \$6,070. It enabled us to support so many organizations, internationally, within the U.S., and locally, which spread the word of Christ in their daily efforts, providing needed dollars for their ongoing projects. Each year we ask the same question when considering an organization or cause to support: *How do they spread the love of Jesus Christ in their endeavors?*

We are pleased to share with you how this money was spent and a little about the groups that were supported.

Internationally

David and Susan Howard - The Howard's arrived in Papua, New Guinea in 1998 and have been working among the Adzera people since 1999. David serves as a translation consultant for the Wycliffe Bible Translators and mentor to Adzera speakers translating the Scriptures into their mother tongue and as the team leader for the new Markham Multi-Language Project. He is also a translation consultant, has been involved in training Papua New Guinea Bible translators, and has served in administrative roles to meet short-term needs. Susan works on Adzera literacy projects when home responsibilities allow. She also teaches a literacy class in Ukarumpa and volunteers to meet various other needs in the community.

The Jesus Film Project - A two-hour docudrama about the life of Christ, according to the Gospel of Luke. This film project has been seen in every country of the world and translated into over 1500 languages. Since the "JESUS" film was first shown in 1979, more than 490 million people have come to know Christ through the ministry of The JESUS Film Project®. **This equates to one person every 5.5 seconds.** Campus Crusade for Christ oversees this film project.

The Outreach Foundation - for Ukraine - By working with the churches in Ukraine, they are able to directly help the Ukrainian people.

Nationally

Love Package - Decatur Alabama - Our used Sunday School books, devotionals and paperback Bibles were mailed out to missionaries in many parts of the world.

Frontier Fellowship - We help to support Richard Haney, the Executive Director. Frontier Fellowship describes itself as "a mission support group that works with congregations to establish indigenous churches among unreached people." Frontier Fellowship reaches out to believing

communities to engage people groups where the Good News of Jesus and his kingdom is not yet known.

Buckingham Presbyterian Church - to help support hurricane lan victims in Fort Myers, Florida.

Locally

Covenant Woods - we provide assistance for the ongoing cost for senior adults who are no longer able to afford their own care.

Angel Tree Project - Fairfield partnered with Cold Harbor Elementary School to help local families in need. They supplied a list of needs and a few wishes for five children from three families. Because of your generosity, twenty additional families received gift cards to Walmart to make Christmas special. Your gifts brought joy to many children and their families during the Christmas season.


