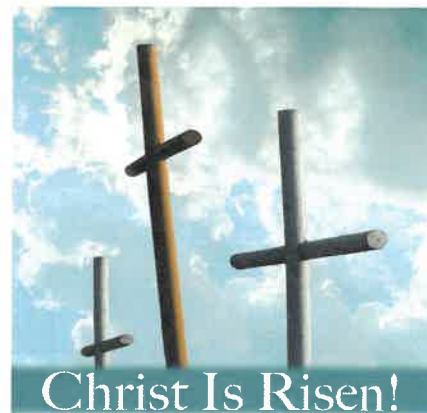

A separate subcommittee was formed to work on the 5th Sunday Day of Service, and determining what service plans will be offered on July 30th.

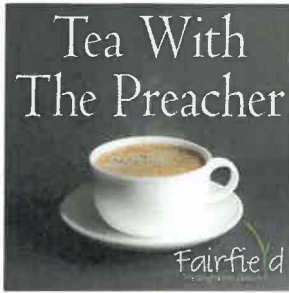


An Easter Prayer

5. Keep adding to your decoration and display it during your Thanksgiving meal.




