Dear friends,

Your Session asked me to share with you some very good news. Because of your wonderful generosity and the good stewardship of the Church's finances, we are very pleased to tell you that we have paid off the last mortgage! When I arrived here twelve years ago, the Church was carrying three separate mortgages simultaneously! By the Grace and Providence of God we whittled those down and were left with the one for our most recent (and largest) addition.

The Session (acting as Trustees) voted to use our reserves to pay off the remaining balance. What this does is use money for which we were getting very low interest to pay off the loan for which we were paying a very high interest rate.

While we are all very excited about this (and we do plan to have a Mortgage *Burning Celebration* in the fall) *we cannot sit back and rest on our laurels*. We have borrowed from ourselves. *Now we have to be diligent* to return our reserves to the level we need to have them. Unfortunately, during the many, many years that Fairfield has had to pay on its mortgages, we have deferred a great number of upkeep projects and improvements to the building. Your Session will be appointing a team to look at what issues we need to deal with and what order we need to tackle them.

I can't begin to thank you enough for your faithfulness thus far. I know that I can count on you to carry us forward so that the next generation of Fairfield Presbyterians will have a building which is well maintained, economical to use and functional to do the mission and ministry they are called to do.

I give thanks to God for the Providence we have experienced, and I give thanks to God for every single one of you in your faithfulness.

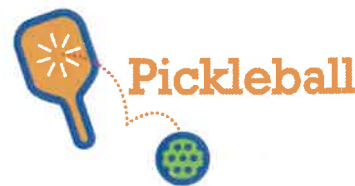


Prayer Shawl Ministry

Stewardship News

The Fairfield Presbyterian Church Endowment Fund was established in 1997, mainly based upon a large gift from Mr. Kemper Fitch. Since then, many members and friends of Fairfield have added to the funds and they've continued to grow. The Endowment Fund is designed to be a transgenerational device for accomplishing the church's mission. Just as the preaching, scholarship, and mission work of past generations of Christians continue to spread the Good News of Jesus Christ to the world both today and tomorrow, the endowment takes contributions made by friends and members and invests them so that these faithful gifts will continue to assist the church and its work for generations to come.

The Stewardship & Finance Committee has completed the report on the Fairfield Presbyterian Church Endowment Fund for the years 2019 through 2022. Over the past 4 years, we have had nearly 20 new funds established! Some of the funds were started from memorial gifts for lost loved ones. Others were gifts to honor members who impacted the giver's Christian development. Still others started with contributions to certain ministries the donors wanted to ensure were supported for future generations. Total Endowments more than doubled in size over the past 4 years, increasing from \$127,779.36 to \$328,238.21.

MCEF News Mechanicsville Churches Emergency Functions (MCEF) and One Stop Shop (OSS)

Greetings from MCEF and the One Stop Shop. A couple of things to report this month:

- The pantry had 138 sign ins in April (representing 408 persons in the household). We also welcomed 8 new clients.
- The new procedure for receiving requests for financial assistance through the website is working well. In April we received 25 requests and were able to help 11.
- Pantry needs: boxed meals, bar soap and canned meats. As always, whatever you can donate is greatly appreciated.
- Clothing needs: men's T-shirts (all sizes and colors, but especially larger sizes) long and short sleeve; women's tops (all sizes, but especially larger sizes).
- No more winter clothes. Moving on to spring and summer.

If you haven't already heard, Tools 4 Teachers won the Hanover Volunteerism Award at the ceremony in May. What an honor. The teachers of Hanover County have expressed how much this helps keep money in their own pockets throughout the year. Please visit the MCEF website to see what supplies they collect on a regular basis.

Besides eggs, MCEF is buying more food for the shelves to supplement donations. Protein rich food and the basics make up our grocery lists. We know that everyone is feeling a pinch at the grocery store and appreciate all the donations of food and money. Our mission is to be good stewards or what we are given. THANK YOU.

What you need:

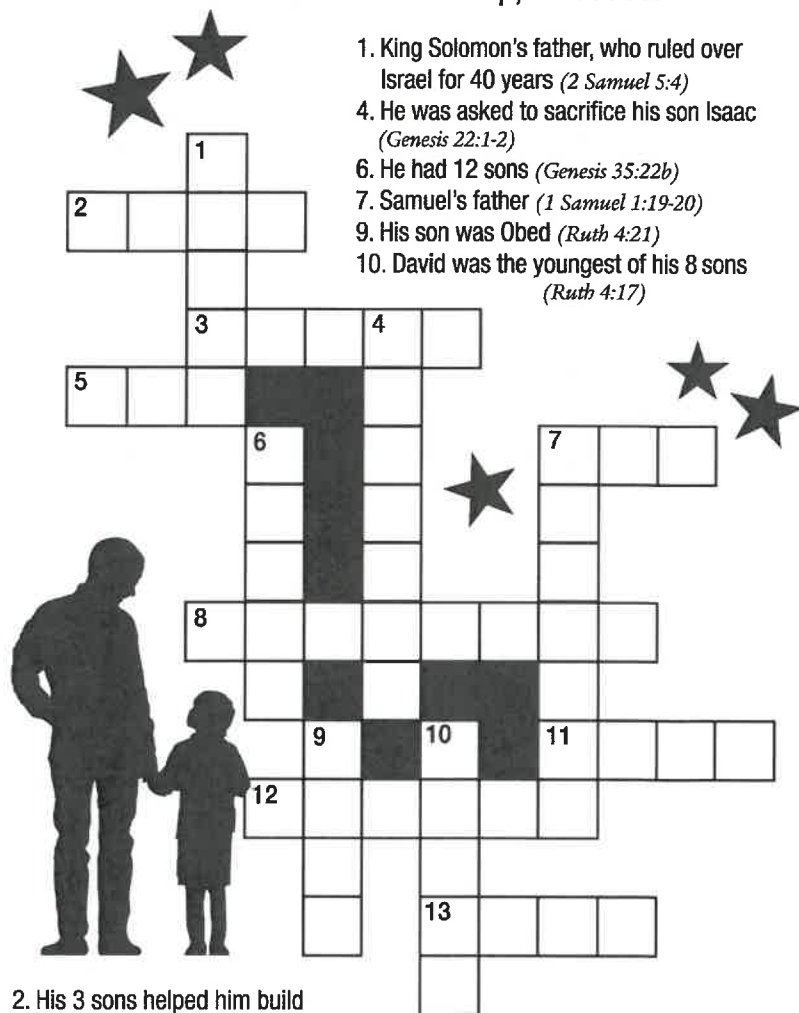
- Paper
