#### "Clear Eyes, Full Hearts, Can't Lose!"

If you'll forgive a 2<sup>nd</sup> sports tv show metaphor in a row ... our 2023 Stewardship theme "Wholehearted"

reminds me of a rallying phrase from "Friday Night Lights," an early Netflix show that ran a decade ago. Before taking the field, Coach Taylor of the Western Texas Dillon High School football team, says: "Clear eyes, full hearts, can't lose!" to a response from his team of "can't lose!" The scene is pure gold for fans of sports to shows or movies.

"Full hearts" is not quite a phrase you'd expect to hear a football team use as a rallying cry. Such a valentine-y phrase carries a gentle sensibility to it, something said before a hug, not a full speed tackle. For the tv show, based off a novel by H. G. Bissinger, the phrase is a deeply humanizing one. The high school kids in this show, growing up in a small, economically depressed town, are in need of much more than football wins. Even though the sport is the center of social life for their community, the unity and family that are nurtured through it, are what matters most.

Now, of course, "winning" isn't what church is about. We are no longer in the midst of church softball leagues. Pickleball is our hot commodity, yet, though it remains relatively non-competitive. It's fair to say we're not really in this business to "win games." However, we're certainly in the full hearts business. We certainly believe in nurturing one another in faith, as whole people,

encouraging gifts, supporting each other when we're weak, and sharing who we are with the larger community.

To take on "wholehearted" as a theme means acknowledging and celebrating who we are as Christ's beloved, as God's children. It means believing that when we are living our authentic lives with one another, receiving and sharing the love given to us, we are carrying out the work of being Christ's church in the world. To be "wholehearted," to have hearts full of love and grace, is to live lives of gratitude - taking part in the church's mission of serving, healing, and transforming our community.

As we enter this stewardship season, I'm hopeful we'll do so not held up by numbers, by winning or losing, by market driven success... but rather by asking ourselves "are our hearts full?" If not, what do we need to pray for, to take part in. How can we share what we have, in word, deed, and action, that Christ's work may continue on through us, and through our church.

Clear eyes, full hearts, can't lose...let's take the field!

We are approaching a wonderfully busy time of the year. All of us need to make sure we take time to breathe and reflect. On October 23 MCEF began to give out extra bags that is called a Thanksgiving bag - and if there is food left over after Thanksgiving, it will be a holiday bag until the end of the year. Churches have been generous in their giving of stuffing, gravy, mashed potatoes, yams, cornbread mix, creamed soup, collards/mixed greens, peas, carrots and brownie mix for this offering. Fairfield youth decorated bags especially for this event and MCEF is thankful for the help.

Minutes of the monthly meeting of MCEF will now be listed on the first page of the website at the very bottom under **More Information**. Hope you will check them out for current needs.

MCEF is spending \$1,800 - \$2,000 a month on food to supplement donations. MCEF only purchases protein rich food items and bar soap, paper towels, and toilet paper. Year to date, 1500 sign ins, 138 new clients, 1818 second helpings. For the shelves the following items are needed: soup, condiments (mayo, ketchup, mustard), boxed cereal and canned meat products.

Looking for other items to donate? Consider the following:

- Coats for all! Jackets or 3/4 length are most popular - washable is preferred! No dry cleaning please.
- Women's XL and larger tops for fall and winter.
- Men's sweatshirts (no advertisement logos please)
- New socks and underwear for adults, girls and toddlers.
- Toddlers and Children's clothing (fall & winter)
- Linens: bed linens and towels.
- NO MORE SUMMER CLOTHES PLEASE!

# A Thanksgiving Day Prayer


Dear Father,







## Under-aged Thinking



Handicrafts can spark appreciation for simple items. Weave this basket as a gift.




### What you need:

- Paper plate
- Pencil
- Scissors
- Yarn (different colors)

#### What you do:


- In the center of the plate, trace something round. Draw 9 lines (evenly spaced) from the circle to the plate's edge.
- Cut along each line, stopping at the center circle. Trim more of the plate off so the cuts make a gradual V shape.
- Fold the plate's sides upward to form basket sides. Keep these upright as you weave a bowl-shaped basket.
- 4. Begin weaving a length of yarn at the circle's base. Hold the end of the yarn in place as you spread the length over and under each side of the plate.
- Switch colors to make a pattern. Keep the yarn tight as you weave up the sides.
- 6. To finish, bend down any remaining paper. Leave a tail of yarn and tuck it under a woven portion. Share your craft with a friend!
