## **Choir Notes:**

This morning's introit, "O God Beyond All Praising" is a new hymn written by Englishman Michael Perry in 1982. Perry wrote the words and then used a melody written by the English orchestral composer, Gustav Holst. The melody comes from a portion of his orchestral work "The Planets" written in 1921. David played this melody as a prelude a couple of weeks ago on the organ. The words to the first stanza are:

"O God beyond all praising, we worship you today and sing the love amazing that songs cannot repay; for we can only wonder at every gift you send, at blessings without number and mercies without end. We lift our hearts before you and wait upon your Word, We honor and adore you, our great and mighty Lord."

This hymn is not in our hymnal, but perhaps we may sing it in worship in the future. It is a majestic song of praise.

The choir's anthem, *Great is Thy Faithfulness*, also comes from England. Like the introit, the lyrics were first a poem written by Thomas Chisholm in the early 1920's. Thomas admitted there was no dramatic story behind the poem. He sent this poem to his musician hymn, William Runyan, who was so moved by the poem that he prayed earnestly for special guidance when writing the tune. The hymn was published with the melody in 1923 and has been a source of strength for many since then. The Refrain of the song is a paraphrase of Lamentations 3:22.

The Offertory, "I Love to Tell the Story," was also a poem written by an English poet that was set to music by an American hymn writer, William Fischer. The poem was written by Arabella Hankey in 1866. Hankey began her ministry early in her life. She taught Sunday School at her church and when she was 18, organized a Bible study for factory girls in London. Fifty years later, several of these "young girls" attended her funeral. Fischer composed the melody for thee words and the hymn was published in an American hymnal in 1869.
