Pastor's Dear Friends, Post Lent is sneaking up on us quickly this year! Easter is a moving holy day (in both senses of that phrase!) and never falls on the same Sunday two years in a row. In ancient times, the phases of the moon served as a "calendar" for the people and particularly for religious practices. Even as recently as our American history, the moon was used to determine schedules. Several of the fraternal orders that dotted America's countryside had what they called, "Full Moon Lodges" which would hold their meetings on the evenings of full moons. This was extremely practical for them before the advent of modern lighting on our streets and highways. Not only did the moon serve as the reminder of when to meet, but the light of the full moon enabled them to travel safely to their destination.


In ancient Israel, many different holy days and remembrance festivals were centered around the movement of the moon. The Spring Holy Days of Passover were marked by the first full moon of the season. The Christian remembrance of Passion Week and the celebration of Easter are similarly tied to the system used for Passover. We celebrate Easter on the first Sunday after the first full moon following the Spring equinox. The dates of Easter are not a constant. But the reason we celebrate Easter and prepare for that throughout the season of Lent is unchanging!

Easter, if you think about it, is unfathomable. God dying for us. Jesus rising from the dead.

These are mind-blowing truths. That is why we need Lent - it takes a lot of preparation to look at who we are and whose we are with open hearts and minds, to even begin to understand these truths! Without this "prep work," we cannot begin to understand the full meaning of the good news of Jesus Christ's suffering, death, and resurrection.

Please take every opportunity you have both privately and with your church family to prepare your hearts and minds during this season of Lent so that t his year's Easter will be the most meaningful one ever in your life and in the life of the church.




Upcoming Worship Services

CROSS OF ASHES — On Ash Wednesday, as Lent begins, worshipers' foreheads are often marked with ashes in the sign of the cross. The ashes traditionally come from burning palm branches from the

previous Palm Sunday. In the Old Testament, ashes were a sign of mourning and repentance. Today, some worshipers wipe off the ashes before leaving church, to symbolize being cleansed from sin by Jesus' death; others wear the ashes the rest of the day, carrying the cross of Christ into the world. Reciting Genesis 3:19 often accompanies the placement of ashes: "You are dust, and to dust you shall return."

Get our new Fairfield Church Directory App

Our new directory app is here and ready to be used! If you wish to install and use it on your device, email office@fairfieldpcusa.org requesting your unique identifier code (see below) and follow these instructions:

STEP 1: DOWNLOAD

If you have an iOS device:

- Go to the App Store and search for 'universal church directory'
- Select the "GET" button, then select "INSTALL" when prompted. When the App has finished installing, select "OPEN"

If you have an Android device:

- Go to the Google Play store and search for 'universal church directory'
- Select "INSTALL" to download and install the App. This will display a popup window, in which you should select the "ACCEPT" button

STEP 2: ACTIVATE

When the App is finished downloading/installing, click the "OPEN" button. You will be prompted to enter a unique identifier code. Contact the church office to receive yours. Each family has their own unique code, which can be provided to you so you can gain access to the app. Once entered, you're good to go!

Under-aged Thinking



Make this heartfelt craft as a decoration or gift.

What you need:

- Yarn
- Scissors
- Parchment paper
- Baking sheet
- Heart-shaped cookie cutters
- ¼ cup cornstarch
- ½ cup water
- Adult help



What you do:

- 1. Cut yarn into 12-inch pieces.
- 2. Place cookie cutters atop a baking sheet lined with parchment paper.
- Combine cornstarch and water in a saucepan. Heat mixture over medium heat, stirring until thick and smooth. Remove from heat and cool to form a "glue."
- 4. Dip each piece of yarn into the mixture to coat completely. Squeeze off any excess.
- Place yarn in the cookie cutters, allowing pieces to cross and loop within the heart. Add more until the cookie cutter is filled and the yarn looks like a heart.
- Remove cookie cutters and bake the sheet for two hours at 150°F, or until hearts are dry and hard.




