#### At The Table

I have not counted the time my wife and I spent together at the dinner table last year compared to, say, 5-6 years ago. However, I am certain if I counted the minutes, it would be

significantly shorter. This is absolutely due to my precious, beloved children. I'm sure parents of young children can certainly relate. Despite our best efforts, by the time we've gotten our children settled at the table, actually putting food in their mouths, and drinking their beverages, we find we have little time left to sit down and enjoy our own meals before our children are clamoring to get up and get to the next thing on their very busy agendas.

This season of Lent, we have been dining with Jesus, as he encountered others at tables, or told parables of table encounters. These meals are often interrupted, cut short, and filled with any number of unexpected moments. Each Sunday, we've been invited to consider the times we have been at tables of fellowship, tables of service, tables of worship and prayer. How has Jesus been present at these tables? How can we be more attentive to Christ's presence when such gatherings do not play out as expected?

We've had some wonderful table experiences lately. In November, we filled the Family Center with tables to celebrate a paid off mortgage. The

first Sunday of every month, we've gathered around dinner tables, for intergenerational fellowship following Joy Choir, youth group, and Bible studies. In February, we gathered around tables on a Saturday evening, while the youth group served us and we enjoyed wonderful music.

As we look to our next table gatherings, nourished by our Lenten conversations, let us consider who has not been coming to our table fellowships. Let us consider how we can bring the joy and meaning of these table fellowships beyond the rooms of this church and into our hurting world. Bringing food, bringing joy, bringing hope, to those who need these things the most.

My wife and I could always just wait until after our kids are asleep to sit at our dinner table and enjoy a meal in peace and quiet, in our own time. But, then we'd be missing out on all of the chaotic joy and laughter that comes from dining together as a family. Our mealtimes are rarely what we expect or hope for them to be. And that's a good thing. Let us dine with Christ, with grateful hearts.

#### Dear Friends in Christ:





# News from Mechanicsville Churches Emergency Functions (MCEF) and the One Stop Shop (OSS)

Many thanks to the middle and high school classes of FPC. This fun group and their advisors came to MCEF on a Saturday morning to learn about MCEF and mark and shelve the food they brought to the pantry. You all are awesome!

MCEF's final numbers for the year 2023 have been calculated. Because of the continuing generosity of churches, individuals, businesses in Mechanicsville, the One Stop Shop served 373 families (for a total of 1,134 people) with 3,268 bags of food, 1,062 bags of clothing and 141 bags of linens. 180 families were helped with utilities, rent, fuel oil and prescriptions totaling \$87,378. Hanover Senior Rides gave 2,109 rides. Volunteers gave of their time and energy with over 16,000 volunteer This ministry is truly blessed and continues to serve our friends and neighbors in 23111 and 23116. It should also be noted that when the food pantry sees someone from outside our zip codes, they go away with a bag of food and a list of pantries that may be in their area.

Having just received a generous donation of winter coats from Mechanicsville High School, please save your coats until next year. MCEF is now accepting spring clothing.

Donation days are the 1<sup>st</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> Sundays of the month from 2-3:30pm.

## Time for Spring Cleaning!



# Under-aged Thinking




Try this chilly new take on a healthy snack.

- Parchment paper


#### What you do:


