To my Fairfield family,

I wish to thank my Fairfield Church friends for all of the prayers and thoughts you offered to me and the family of Kaitlyn Whitmer Dula, my great-niece. She was a wonderful young lady of 31 who we think God called home far too soon leaving a husband, a 4 year old son, 2 older sisters and their families and her grandparents, my brother and sister-in-law to mourn her death as well as many friends.

I'm convinced God had a bigger plan for her which she had partially fulfilled in her short 31 years and will continue to fulfill even after death. She was a very gifted athlete from an early age, participating in many sports; but as she grew, volleyball became her favorite. She played volleyball all through high school, winning many personal performance honors as well as a volleyball scholarship to college.

She accepted Christ as her savior as a young preteen and was very active in her church. These concepts she took with her to school, and

on the court both as a player and coach. After college she got a job as a teacher of business as well as volleyball coach at the same high school where she had played. She taught her students that honesty, kindness, hard work, dedication, and respect were all a part of the volleyball game and just as important as learning the techniques of the game. She instilled in all her students that these same principles applied to everyday life.

Her volleyball teams were very successful as she led them to the state championship games several seasons. As a result of her love of the game, the love of her teams past and for ones in the future, a scholarship has been established in her name so that volleyball team members at the school where she played, taught and coached will have an opportunity to continue in the game she loved at the college level. Her values and teaching/coaching skills will not be forgotten. All though she is gone from her family, friends and students; in God's infinite way our prayers have been answered.

Kaitlyn's family told me how much they appreciated the thoughts and prayers of so many people. They received encouragement and comfort from knowing so many people were holding them in their prayers. Her team of doctors tried everything to conquer this very rare form of cancer but when it was obvious that they could not do anymore, she accepted the diagnosis with inoperable cancer. She was at peace with the life and time God had given her on earth and was prepared to meet her Savior.

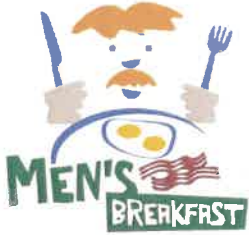

MCEF is only taking donations of summer clothes now. Please save your coats and winter clothing until September. Speaking of clothing donations - and this doesn't apply to just Fairfield - we notice that we are re-donating a number of donations to the schools for recycling. I know it is hard to just throw away clothing that you no longer need, want or can wear. Just keep in mind - if you wouldn't wear it, don't donate it. The "cash for schools" bins can take all that stained, ripped, ragged clothing you no longer want and the school gets a percentage of cash for it. The bins are white and green and located in the outer parking lots of most of our elementary schools.

Serve protein-packed waffles for a family breakfast on **FATHER'S DAY** or any special occasion.


What you need:

- Adult help
- Waffle maker
- Blender
- 1 cup old-fashioned oats
- 1 cup cottage cheese
- 6 eggs
- Cooking spray
- Diced strawberries
- Powdered sugar



What you do:


1. With adult help, preheat the waffle maker.
2. In the blender, add oats and cottage cheese. Crack eggs in a separate bowl, then add to the blender. Pulse to combine the mixture. Then blend on medium speed for 10 seconds.
3. Coat the waffle maker with cooking spray. Spoon about 1/3 cup batter onto the iron and close.
4. Carefully remove the waffle when it's golden brown. Repeat with remaining batter.
5. Top with strawberries and powdered sugar. Makes about 6 waffles.
