



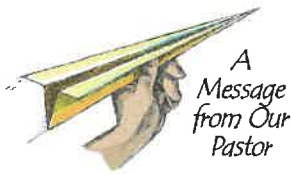

### Summer of Service and Beyond

I would say it was by about the 4th or 5th hallway in Henry Marsh Elementary III where I began to doubt whether or not we were making a difference. This June, 5 of our youth joined Salisbury and First Presbyterian Churches for a week of service, which started at this school. On this particular day, I had been the taskmaster, directing a team of middle school boys armed with multipurpose cleaner and increasingly dirty rags, in wiping down walls and railings. About the time I was doubting our effectiveness, a teacher stopped by to commend us on how good the walls and railings looked, giving us a heartfelt thanks for what we were doing.

Later that morning, I also had the chance to peer in on a couple of our youth who had the opportunity to join in on a couple of summer school kindergarten rooms, reading with them and playing games. The connection they had made was written over everyone's faces, and there were tears when it came to say goodbye, even after only spending a couple hours together. It was a lovely moment.

Thursday, our group spent the morning at Shalom Farms, enjoying freshly grown fruits and vegetables, while assisting in harvesting. We learned about the work they do to provide fresh food to communities where such is difficult to find. I think it was eye opening for many and hopefully sparked interest in a return visit. Our team had a wonderful week together, and I'm

certain they left with a desire to keep on serving others in the name of Christ.

Thankfully, we don't have to wait too long until the next opportunity! This month, we'll be digging a bit more into the soil of serving, particularly on the subject of hunger and food access. Such will be the theme of our "Feed my Sheep" intergenerational VBS program July 7-9th, which will feature a visit by Shalom Farms on the final day, where we will learn about food access and service opportunities in our own metro area.

On July 20th, we'll turn talk into action by participating in a Rise Against Hunger food packing event, making 10,000 meals to be sent out internationally to places of greatest need. Yes, you read that number right. We can do it.

I'm hopeful all of these service opportunities will spark something within you, as you read this letter. I am seeking to gather adults and youth willing to take time in planning service opportunities and service trips for our church community. It's a fun and important way to be involved at Fairfield, and I'm certain many of you have those gifts to share. Pray about it, and let me know!

Until then, keep a bottle of cleaner and towel at hand, stock up on clothes that can get dirty, and let's pay attention to where the Holy Spirit may be calling us next!

The following is a summary of the Memorial Garden and Columbarium Committee presentation on May 29, 2024. The meeting was well attended and some excellent questions were asked.

- The Memorial Garden and Columbarium Committee is a subcommittee of the Session, but will be self-sustaining and financed by a fund separate from the church budget. The sale of niches and memorial plaques will provide most of the construction costs, however, benches, large containers for plants, and a center sculpture could also be considered as memorials.
- The 3 columbarium in Phase 1 will have 90 niches, with memorial columns with a total of 60 memorial plaques. Each niche can hold 2 sets of cremains (cremated remains). The cost per niche will be in the \$5,000 - \$6,000 range and the memorial plaques \$450-500. The prices include engraving and perpetual care.
- There is a banner on the future site location across from the playground. The location was chosen for the parking and handicapped accessibility.
- The niches are designated for Church members and their families. Other persons would be considered by the Session by written request.
- The Committee members are Beth Young ([curlweyoung@comcast.net](mailto:curlweyoung@comcast.net)), Marge Wantz ([mnwantz@gmail.com](mailto:mnwantz@gmail.com)), Billy Putze ([billyputze@comcast.net](mailto:billyputze@comcast.net)), Donna Hohman ([m.hohmans4@verizon.net](mailto:m.hohmans4@verizon.net)) and Larry Hansbough ([franandlarry@atlanticbb.net](mailto:franandlarry@atlanticbb.net)). Please contact one of us with any questions or interest.
- In the fall, we plan more presentations and printed materials that will be available in the Narthex and Welcome Center.


June saw 153 sign-ins at the OSS. That represents 455 persons in the household. Those numbers are holding steady for the first half of the year. 11 new clients were added.

MCEF volunteers will once again be working at the August 10-11 NASCAR races. Remember, that is our “egg money.”

Clothing needs to consider are summer and winter items for children under age 5 years of age and men’s underwear size M.

For the pantry, please think about canned peas, pasta sauce, canned meat, toothbrushes and toothpaste, and bar soap. With school out for summer break, healthy snacks will also be appreciated.

Why do stars appear to twinkle? Try this experiment to find out!



**What you need:**

- Aluminum foil
- Large glass bowl
- Water
- Flashlight



**What you do:**


1. Crumple the foil into a ball. Carefully unfold it and lay it flat on the ground.
2. Fill the bowl with water and place it on the foil.
3. Turn off the lights and make the room as dark as possible. Shine the flashlight about 1 foot from the water's undisturbed surface. Light will reflect onto the foil.
4. Then tap your finger on the water's surface. As the water moves, what happens to the light on the foil?
5. This flickering simulates scintillation, which happens when starlight enters Earth's atmosphere. As light passes through layers of gas and water, it refracts and appears to twinkle.
