Are you looking for an opportunity to meet with your fellow Christians to further your understanding of God and how he's working in our lives? The Adult Discipleship Committee has planned this year's Rally Day.

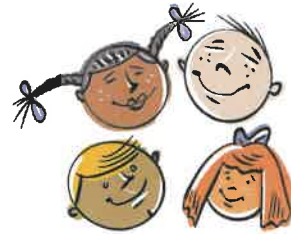
