\*\*This morning's prelude, "The Risen Christ," is the resurrection story in musical form. Each of the four movements describes part of the story. Movement one is "Very early morning," depicting the stillness of early morning and the songs of the first birds. The second movement, "The earthquake," is **very loud and** tumultuous; it frightens us awake while the stone is rolled away from the tomb. The calm melody of the third movement is the message of the Angel to Mary, "Fear not!" We are asked "why do we seek the living among the dead? He is not here, he is risen!" The fourth and final movement carries our joyous exclamations of "Alleluia! The strife is o'er." With this hymn tune, we (along with Mary and the other women) carry the good news of the resurrection back to the disciples and the rest of the world.
