Our son, Bruce, started soccer this Spring. It's about what you'd expect for an under-4 league - a

small herd of eager boys and girls following the ball around the field until it inevitably goes out of bounds or into the goal. The kids are constantly running on and off the field, mid-play, as if it's a hockey game. Oftentimes there's more fun to be found for them in playing in the dirt and grass than actually playing the game their beloved parents invested in them to play.

But you know what? I learned quickly that all of that is absolutely ok. These precious young children are taking in more than we realize. The ball kicks they do make contact with, few as they may be, are still ball kicks. They are enjoying putting on shin guards and jerseys, they have a blast being a team together, following instructions from a coach, and most importantly, having their family and friends cheer them on from the sideline, no matter what they do.

Sometimes we score a "goal" with a wonderful ministry or mission venture. Other times we find ourselves out of bounds, out of time, lost on the field somewhere. And yet, we keep cheering one another on, our coach, our leader, our God, is proud of us for showing up as a team. And that's worth celebrating.

This May we will celebrate our coaches, our teachers, in Sunday School and beyond. Thanks be to God for those who cheer us on.

- 1 cup heavy cream
- 3 Tablespoons powdered sugar
- 1 teaspoon lemon juice
- 6-10 strawberries, washed and sliced
- 6 slices of white bread
- Cellophane
- Adult help



What you do:

- 1. With an electric mixer, whip the cream cheese in a bowl until fluffy.
- Add cream, powdered sugar, and lemon juice. Continue whipping on high speed until mixture is stiff.
- 3. On each slice of bread, spread a layer of the mixture. Then arrange some sliced strawberries on top.
- 4. Place the sandwiches together, with filling on the inside.
- Wrap tightly in cellophane. Chill for two hours so the filling sets.
- 6. Trim off crusts with a serrated knife. Cut sandwiches in squares or triangles. Serve and enjoy!



MISSION FUNDS DISBURSEMENTS FOR 2024

Giving is a reminder of the love God has shared with each of us. Through your generous contributions received last year during our annual Mission Drive, we were blessed to make many contributions to organizations, internationally, within the U.S., and locally, to continue to spread the word of Jesus Christ in their daily outreach. The \$10,884 you shared with the committee allowed us to make funds available for a number of continuing projects. Every year we ask the same question when reviewing the organizations or causes to support: *How will these dollars be used to spread the love of Jesus Christ in their communities?*

We researched and discussed each organization well before issuing checks in 2024 and we are happy to share with you how this money was assigned and a little about the groups that FPC supported.

INTERNATIONALLY

David and Susan Howard - David and Susan are back in Papua, New Guinea for their 27year work among the Adzera people as translators and literacy teachers with Wycliffe Bible Translators. Not only does David work to translate the scriptures into the native languages, but the Howard's are looking for ways to provide materials for the local elementary schools who are teaching in Adzera. They are hoping to provide printed Adzera Scripture to churches throughout the Adzera area. They work daily to provide various forms of electronic formats of scripture via videos, apps and story books that are free to download without requiring a data connection, as well as a website to distribute and promote Adzera Scriptures.

The Jesus Film Project - A Campus Crusade for Christ organization that began distributing a two-hour docudrama about the life of Christ, according to the Gospel of Luke in 1979, has been seen in every country of the world and translated into over 2219 languages and is available in films, apps, equipment and other digital tools. The Jesus Film Project App allows for electronics to display multiple versions of Jesus's life, including new stories of the crucifixion and resurrection.

CRU (Campus Crusade for Christ) - Bibles were purchased for distribution as CRU partners with 191 nations around the world. Additionally, CRU offers a list of resources and opportunities for students in college and high school across the U.S. They support Campus Ministries for high schools, military, athletes and families.

The Outreach Foundation - Fuels the global mission of Christ, by growing trusted relationships, that inspire historic Christian faith as it is revealed in God's Word and expressed by the ecumenical creeds and confessions that Jesus Christ is the only Lord and Savior. This group helps to develop long-term relationships with global partners who are working diligently to keep the church alive and growing as it builds and strengthens ministries within multiple regions of the world where Christ's Word is just beginning to flourish.

NATIONALLY

Love Package - Decatur Alabama - Your used Sunday School literature, devotional and paperback Bibles are collected in the Union Class and sent out to missionaries in many parts of the world where the Word of the Lord is taught to small groups. They are often used as a tool to teach English while bringing Jesus Christ to life within their hearts.

Frontier Fellowship - A mission support group that works with believing communities to engage people and groups to spread the Good News of Jesus and His Kingdom to areas of unreached people. God desires to be worshiped by all peoples. Many people have little or no access to the message of Jesus Christ and his ministry. Frontier Fellowship enters into some of the most remote locations in the world spreading the Good News, just as Jesus did.

Theology Matters - Equipping the next generation of ministers for Presbyterian and other Christian congregations, *Theology Matters* provides important resources for congregational leaders who are seeking the truth of the Gospel of Jesus Christ. They encourage, instruct, and inspire the Christian community and it's elders through the clear and coherent articulation of theology according to God's word.

LOCALLY


Covenant Woods - FPC is so blessed to have many faithful members who are residents of the Covenant Woods Community. It is our pleasure to contribute monetary assistance to the Covenant Fund that provides for the ongoing assistance for residents who through no fault of their own, are no longer able to afford their care.

Angel Tree Project - FPC has partnered with Cold Harbor Elementary School for several years to assist local families with meeting their children's needs during the holidays. Families express the children's clothing and personal needs and several small surprises for Christmas. Your kindness has provided us being able to supply these needs and wishes, making Christmas exciting and meaningful. Each year we have been able to supply these families with small gift cards to Walmart to purchase a special meal or meet other needs. The Men of the Church has provided food baskets for the Thanksgiving holidays for these families, in addition to gift cards to Kroger for their turkey or main meat.

Pastor Discretionary Fund - Our pastors are always aware of situations that necessitate monetary needs. Available mission dollars are offered, no questions asked, to be used discretely, when needed, to meet the needs within our church family and community.
