Dear friends,

In a few days, I will be heading to Tripp Lake in northern Pennsylvania. I have been doing my study leave there for more than 20 years. Yet, this year will be very different from all

the previous years. I will be using some vacation time in addition to my study leave time because part of my hopes for this time away is to discern how to best prepare Fairfield for the next chapter that lies before you and to prepare myself for letting go and trusting God to guide and direct you.

My time as your Pastor is drawing to a conclusion very quickly. I have no idea where these past, nearly fifteen years have gone. On July 27th, we took the formal step of voting to ask the Presbytery of the James to dissolve the Pastoral relationship between all of you and me. It sounds harsh, and maybe that is intentional so that the reality of it is felt. It isn't easy for me, and a few of you have expressed your sadness as well.

Unlike when a Pastor leaves to answer a new call, when a Pastor retires, there is the extra step of the Presbytery reporting to the Board of Pensions in Philadelphia that I am indeed retiring

and eligible to receive my pension. That is why we started the process a bit earlier than "normal".

You were kind enough to approve the plan that the Personnel and Stewardship Teams put forward and that your Session voted to approve. Your kindness to me allows me to conclude my active ministry with you on October 15th (final Sunday of October 12th) and my formal conclusion on December 31, 2025. Why the difference? While my last paycheck will be on October 15th, I won't be taking my pension until January 2026. Two reasons for doing it this way are 1) this will cover Debby and me with our medical insurance until January, and 2) we have a very small inherited IRA that we will use for those 2 ½ months without an income and avoid excessive taxes on its withdrawal.

Your kindness in allowing us this option is deeply appreciated. My love for you and my gratitude to God for bringing me here will never be diminished.

August Sermon Series: Faces of Faith



Fairfield Youth Mission Trip Recap

Ten youth, four adults, an SUV we nicknamed "Starbucks" and a passenger van we nicknamed "Shirley Temple," traveled across our state on Sunday, June 20th for a week of service with Appalachia Service Project. We were loaded up with tools, cots for sleeping on a gym floor, work clothes, and other essentials, ready to take on the week before us.

We arrived in Wise County at our home base - an old high school with breathtaking views of the surrounding mountains in Appalachia, VA, and quickly unloaded our belongings. We were joined by youth groups from churches in PA, MN, and RI, all different denominations, all veterans of Appalachia Service Project. Our group bonded quickly with one another, and with youth from these other churches. Sharing a large gym floor in the heat of the summer tends to do make that happen!

We were split into two groups: one tasked with repairing a roof, another tasked with building a deck, then painting a bathroom. There were moments of waiting for supplies, as well as moments when we worked feverishly against the clock before the weather got too hot. Everyone worked hard and found something to do along the way. Two of our youth even built a birdhouse with construction scraps for our homeowner!

The theme of our week with ASP was "Be the Light," inspired by Matthew 5:16, "In the same way, let your light shine before others, that they may see your good deeds and glorify your Father in heaven." Through morning devotionals and evening sessions, we considered how the work we do to serve others is a way to enlighten a weary world, to show them Christ through our actions. Our crew was shining bright all week, almost as bright at the hot sun which tried, but could not, dampen our spirits.

Through meeting homeowners, community members, and taking part in "culture night square dancing," we not only shined a light, but experienced the light of others all week. The light of Fairfield's prayers also sustained us in our time out there. Thank you for your donations, your prayers, and your curisoity!


